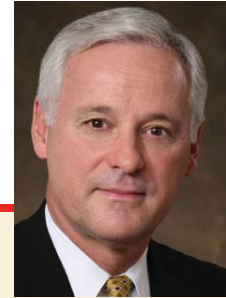




Fort Bend Independent School District



TIMOTHY R. JENNEY, M.B.A., Ph.D. Superintendent

Dr. Tim Jenney became the district's eighth superintendent in September 2006. Since coming to the district, his organizational focus has been to build upon a solid foundation based on an initial needs assessment of the district. A model for instructional management has been developed based on input from the school board, staff, and the many constituent groups of the district. Jenney is known as a strategist who has an appreciation for the importance of including the community in the education process. He has built his reputation on his analytical approach to fiscal management and systems operations, and an unwavering commitment to student engagement with a focus on student achievement.

EDUCATIONAL PHILOSOPHY

Jenney believes in the educational value of a united school system, one that is interconnected through common processes and annual continuous improvement targets. He believes that for a school system to be successful, curricular and instructional expertise must be applied equally for all so that every student reflects a higher level of achievement. For in the final analysis, he believes it is the student who is the sole focus of our efforts.

- With more than 36 years of educational experience, Jenney assumed his first position as superintendent in 1983, accepting superintendent appointments in four increasingly larger school districts in Michigan, Oklahoma, and South Carolina prior to his tenure at Virginia Beach.

Noteworthy accomplishments have been his awards by the PTA of an endowed annual student scholarship, the 2005 Child Advocate of the Year, and the Virginia President's Award, the highest award bestowed in recognition of outstanding service to children. He was also named the National Association for Gifted Children's Administrator of the Year (NAGC) in 2001. Shortly thereafter, Jenney was named the national winner of the Educational Technology Administrator of the Year award. Dr. Jenney brings 36 years of educational experience to Fort Bend ISD.
