Information & "How To's":

First Day of School 2016

- August 22, 2016 7:30 am 2:45 pm, doors open at 6:30 am.
- Students, look for lists posted on windows in food court
 - Go to your assigned advisory room.
 - You will receive your schedule.
 - If students need a locker, they can to request one.
- Staff and student aides are available to help with directions.
 - Encourage your student to ask for directions if needed.
 - You will have a few days before tardies are strictly enforced.
- All lunches are 5th period.
 - There are three 30 minute lunches, A, B, & C, starting at 11:25 am.
 - Bring a lunch the first few days to avoid long lunchroom lines.



Getting Here

- If your student can use the bus, please do. Efficient and easy!
- Doors Open at 6:30 am, Classes start at 7:30 am. Come early to avoid the carpool lines.
- Your student **MUST** have a **tutorial pass** after 7:00 am to go to tutorials.
- Cars may drop-off and pick-up students in two ways:
 - Front Drive
 - The commons or student parking lot
- Student Parking Seniors and Juniors only with permit.

What to Expect

- Textbooks will be assigned using your student's ID number and a barcode system.
 - New to FBISD? Have your student memorize their ID number.
- Photos for ID cards and yearbook will be taken in September
- Tons of homework! Often that first progress report is not great, but your student should bring up their grade, try not to worry.
- In November, freshmen are checked for height, weight (confidential) and blood pressure in the clinic.

Medical

- Sick? Send or email a note within 5 days of absence. Your student takes the note to the attendance office at the front of the school. The email address is Liane.Rosales@fortbend.isd.com.
- Doctor Appointments? Send in a parent note the same day as the appt. AND GET A DOCTOR'S NOTE after the appointment and turn it in to the attendance office.
 - Your student turns in the note to the attendance office in the morning and they will be called from class when it is time to leave.
 - After the appointment, your student must take the doctor's note to the attendance to make it an excused absence.

Things you may not learn from your student

- Planners, specific to Austin, will be for sale during lunches the first few weeks and at Freshman Orientation for \$10.00.
- Daily announcements are made during third period each day and are on the TV screens in the commons. The announcements are posted weekly on <u>www.fortbendisd.com/ahs</u> website.
- Austin Spirit Wear is sold by the Athletic Booster Club at various venues including Friday lunches and football games.
- Discounted football game tickets are on sale the day of all varsity games during lunch. Season tickets are available, see the FBISD website.
- AHS P.T.O., many clubs and boosters sell food items to raise money during lunch or before or after school. Feel free to support these worthwhile groups. They cover expenses the school district cannot for our kids' activities.
- Announcements are occasionally made during lunch and breakfast periods.
- Homecoming football game is Friday, September 30, 2016. The dance is Saturday, October 1st from 8-11 pm. Austin Angel Homecoming Dinner as well as **the AHS Pep Rally is Wednesday, September 28th.** Must purchase a ticket to the dinner from any Austin Angels dance team member.
- Pro-grad means Project Graduation and is a great all-night event for seniors on the night of graduation. Go to http://austinbulldogprograd.weebly.com/

Open House - August 29th at 6:30 pm

- Parents are invited to visit their student's classes for brief talks by each teacher.
 - Learn about class syllabus, conference times, class expectations, grading system
- Bring your student's class schedule. If possible, <u>map it out</u> beforehand, as you'll have 5 minutes to find the next class.
- Freshman and new students are invited to meet with their Link Crew leaders and check-in on how the first few weeks of school are going.
