Principal's Post-It

BEING AN ENCOURAGER

Last week I wrote a note about success. This week I would like to follow up on, what I think, is a very important role that we have as a parent - that of being an encourager. Our kids take in everything we DO and everything we SAY whether we realize it or not. If all we do or say is critical of them or others, we're teaching them to look for what's wrong with the world, and *them*, rather than what's right.

We are ALL critical now and then! I know it can be a battle not to be sometimes. But if children get frequent feedback that is only negative – on their grades, how they perform, their chores, etc. – they **WILL** start feeling bad about themselves and it may lead to feelings of hopelessness – that they'll never satisfy YOU no matter what they do or how hard they try. This past week I had the opportunity to sit with high school students from around the nation at the National Forum for Character Education; these individuals really opened my eyes to what kids have to maneuver in life. They spoke about anxiety and depression and the feelings of helplessness that they sometimes experience when they get overwhelmed with things. They also talked about pressures from adults and what it's like to constantly feel like they are not good enough.

Dr. Peter Grey, an author and research professor at Boston College, states that it would be easy to think that a student's sense of personal control has increased over the last number of decades with all of the choices they may have - choices of careers, fields of study, and advances in technology. Yet Dr. Grey states, "The research indicates that young people's belief that they have control over their own destinies has declined sharply over decades." The kids feel as is adults control their lives and activities.

As a parent, the GOOD NEWS is we have a choice. We can choose to be critical of our kids or we can choose to be supportive and encouraging. Of course, our kids WON'T always be successful at what they do – nor SHOULD they be!! However, win or lose, A or C, we need to let them know that we will be there for them. Our support **MUST** be unconditional and we must encourage our kids to try new things; to risk failure; to explore new activities without thinking they'll lose out on future opportunities if they are not successful.

When my son was a young athlete he was on many baseball teams that were NOT championship teams. That taught him A LOT. On the way home from games I would use a Stephen Covey technique with him – asking him five simple questions:

- 1) Did you do your best? (Focus on EFFORT)
- 2) Did you help your team? (Focus on OTHERS)
- 3) Did you learn something? (Focus on LEARNING opportunity)
- 4) Did you have fun? (Focus on FUN)
- 5) Did you win? (LAST question and sometimes we didn't get there!)

4 out of 5 is a pretty good outcome!! I wanted him to be able to know that **INSIDE** he had what it takes to dig deep when the going gets tough. **AND IT WILL GET TOUGH!** He's not always going to be on championship teams or "win" at everything he does. My job, as a parent, is to encourage him to do his best and focus on what he can control. The rest will take care of itself!! Have a GREAT week – FOCUS on the POSITIVE!!!


Your generous donations allow the PTO to sponsor these functions and provide valuable educational tools!
