## HABITUDES CORNER



This week I read the following quote and it took my breath away:

"We need to care less about whether our children are academically gifted and more about whether they sit with the lonely kid in the cafeteria."

My own children were always put in opportunities to help others – to serve them in Special Olympics, collecting and delivering clothes and blankets for shelters among other activities. Talking about character and being a person of character has always been a top priority in our home. I think one of the reasons that I am enjoying working at the high school level is that my kids are out of high school - one a junior in college and one working successfully. I feel like I have another chance to "parent" kids through this time of their lives. To me, this time of their life is so very important.

Reading, writing, mathematics and all of the other academic courses that they must take are of COURSE important. However, if we are raising kids who are really good at taking tests but cannot get along with others and solve problems together, then we have only done half of our jobs as a community.

This summer I was able to attend The National Leadership Forum and hear Dr. Meria Carstarphen, Superintendent of Atlanta Public Schools. She was interviewed by Dr. Tim Elmore, author of the Habitudes program that we are using two days a week in advisory to teach our students leadership skills.

Two points stood out in the interview:

- 1.) Students participating in social emotional learning programs scored an average of 11% more on achievement tests and are 91% more likely to complete high school. In a survey, 93% of teachers said they want more focus on social emotional learning. They are realizing we need social emotional learning in order to do math, reading, or history well.
- 2.) The National Association of Colleges and Employers looked at what were the top skills that employers actually want from graduates. When we (APS) did the analysis of their top ten, **five** of them were actually the social emotional learning competencies: decision making, problem solving, communication, organization, and prioritization. Even the New York Times reported that kids who scored high on these kinds of social skills are going to be **four times** more likely to graduate from college. These skills must be taught and they can be. Aristotle said more than 2,000 years ago, "To educate the mind without educating the heart is no education at all."

We continue with our lessons. This week students will be writing down what one thing they would like to accomplish in their future. They will be able to have time to discuss what it will take to accomplish that dream – continuing the discussion on their strengths.
