

Level Change Deadline Approaching

Friday, October 28th is the last day students may request a level change from a Pre-AP/AP to academic course (where available). After this deadline, students are expected to remain in their course for the duration of the semester for semester-long courses or the school year for year-long courses.



This week in our leadership lessons during advisory, our students will be learning the leadership principle of the Fun House Mirror. Carnivals often have mirrors that distort how we look. We will talk about how many people, pretend or pose to be better than they really are, or post images only after putting them through filters. Most people do want to make a good impression of themselves so much that they are willing to distort or exaggerate the truth in order to do so.

Dr. Elmore will discuss how he believes each of us carries around four images of ourselves. The visual is a four layered circle. The outer layer represents the image others have of us. The next layer represents the image we project to others. The third layer represents the image we have of ourselves. Finally, the fourth [innermost] layer represents the truth about who we really are. Character is the most inner circle, the other circles are actually excess baggage, and we shouldn't consume ourselves with them.

Distorting who we really are seems like something middle schoolers may do who are struggling with their own self-esteem, trying to find a crowd to fit in to. Unfortunatley, adults do it too. Some simply become more sophisticated at doing it. We will discuss individuals who have made such mistakes as lying on a resume, exaggerated stats, just to make them look better in the eyes of someone else.

What happens inside of people that makes them feel the need to exaggerate the truth in order to gain approval?

The challenge this week will be to make a commitment not to lie – even a little white lie --- because, in the end, a lie is a lie. A commitment to no exaggerate or distort the truth. In conversations, speak honestly about yourself. AT the end of the week, evaluate how difficult this was. How many times did you have to stop yourself?

Don't be too hard on yourself, you *are* a work in progress and with each passing day you can be better!
