
QUESTION	If a student has office aide, athletics, or fine arts, can they bring a note and leave?
ANSWER	NO! Students must remain on campus during any assigned classes. The ONLY way a student can leave is if they are exempt or if a parent comes into the school and checks them out. This applies to all students.
QUESTION	Are Homebound students eligible for exemptions?
ANSWER	Yes, if they meet the grade requirement and the STAAR requirement, they are eligible.
QUESTION	Can students lose exemptions if their grade changes after the forms are submitted May 19th?
ANSWER	No, the grades should be finalized before the exemption form is submitted to the assistant principal.
