2015 Texas Education Agency **State Accountability Ratings**

Fort Bend ISD received a 2015 District accountability rating of Met Standard, and 67 of 70 campuses received a Met Standard rating based on overall student achievement, progress, performance of identified student groups and post-secondary readiness. Under the state's accountability system based on the STAAR test, campuses and districts receive either Met Standard or Improvement Required ratings. FBISD campuses also earned a total of **96 distinctions** – **38** at the high school level, 28 at the middle school level, and 30 at the elementary school level - for high student performance.

Our students are college ready!

Fort Bend ISD is focused on efforts to ensure that all students will graduate ready for their futures - whether those paths lead to a university, technical college or joining the business world. As part of a comprehensive College and Career Ready plan, students will have more choices in their educational pathways, while providing a more holistic approach to their learning as the District aligns its efforts with the State's graduation requirements.

College and Career Readiness

Our mission is to aid every student in Fort Bend ISD in preparing for and achieving his or her post-secondary goals and aspirations. The Five Pillars of College & Career Readiness help with this process.

Success Stats:

Seventy-three percent (3,657) of the Class of 2014 (5,029 graduates total) enrolled in postsecondary education the fall immediately following high school graduation.

The FBISD Advancement Via Individual Determination (**AVID**) program provides intensive college and career support for our first-generation college students. Approximately 1,500 students are currently enrolled in the AVID elective classes, and from the 2014-15 AVID seniors, **92.6%** reported acceptance to a four-year college and **96.9%** have plans to attend a college or university in the fall.

Class of 2015 seniors completed nearly **20,000** active college applications, or approximately four applications per student.

Fort Bend ISD students outperform the Texas and national mean on both the SAT and ACT.

House Bill 5 sets Groundwork for Graduation and Career Planning

High school students will benefit from several changes resulting from HB5 and other education bills that were signed into law during the 83rd Legislative session. Students will benefit from reduced testing, more flexibility in core course options, and strategic use of courses (core and electives) to earn endorsements. Students may choose from a list of five endorsements similar to a major in college. Students may also focus on academics, fine arts, JROTC or Career and Technical Education. Imagine their Futures

Ten Fort Bend ISD high school seniors are candidates for the 2015 United States Presidential Scholars Program. They are among the nation's more than 3,900 candidates identified for the academic component of the program, based on their exceptional scores on the SAT or ACT assessments.

The 2015 Fort Bend ISD graduating seniors were offered more than \$104 million in reported academic and athletic scholarships.

Twenty-one FBISD high school seniors were awarded 2015 Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo scholarships. They are among more than 350 Metropolitan and Opportunity Scholarship winners from Houston area high schools to earn scholarships based on their impressive SAT or ACT test scores.

Fort Bend ISD is proud to announce that **62** high school seniors are finalists in the 2015 National Merit Scholarship Program, which is one of the highest numbers of finalists among the larger school districts in Texas. The 62 FBISD scholars are among 15,000 students chosen as finalists from more than 1.5 million high school seniors in nearly 22,000 United States high schools who earned the 2015 Merit Program by taking the PSAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test.

Fort Bend ISD has been named a 2015 "Best Community for Music Education" by the National Association of Music Merchants Foundation, FBISD ioins 388 school districts across the country in receiving the



prestigious distinction. This is the sixth consecutive year that FBISD has received this honor.

Thirty-nine Fort Bend ISD student musicians were selected as 2015 Texas All-State Musicians by the Texas Music Educators Association. They are among 1,696 students (including 860 All-State Concert and Jazz Band, 220 All-State Orchestra, and 616 All-State Choir students) selected through competitive auditions. All-State is the highest honor a Texas music student can receive, and only three percent of musicians who audition receive All-State honors.

Seven FBISD school band and orchestra programs received recognition as winners in the 2014 Mark of Excellence project, sponsored by The Foundation for Music Education. They were among 224 of the nation's finest musical ensembles to enter the competition and be recognized for their musical achievement.

Fort Settlement Middle School has been designated a 2015 National School of Character by Character.org. The school was recognized for having demonstrated its use of character education and development to drive a positive impact on academics, student behavior and the school climate. This is Fort Settlement's second designation as a National School of Character.

Last year, business and community partners donated approximately \$3.5 million to support student success. In addition, our Volunteers In Public Schools program recorded more than 355,000 volunteer hours. If you attach an hourly rate established by the Independent Sector, the recorded hours equate to more than \$8.3 million dollars in volunteer services provided for our teachers and students.

Since its inception in 1992, the Fort Bend Education Foundation has awarded more than \$31 million in grants to FBISD teachers and schools. During the 2014-2015 school year, the Education Foundation awarded more than \$394,000 to FBISD for teacher and classroom grants.





For the 12th consecutive year, Fort Bend ISD has received a rating of Superior Achieve-

ment by the Texas Education Agency's School FIRST (Financial Integrity Rating System of **Texas).** The Superior Achievement rating is the state's highest mark and serves as an indicator of the quality of the District's financial management and reporting system.

Fort Bend ISD was awarded five $\star\star\star\star\star$ stars in the Texas Comptroller's annual Financial Allocation Study for Texas, or FAST ratings. The annual study examines both academic performance and financial efficiency at Texas school districts and campuses, and identifies those that deliver a high-quality education at relatively low costs. This is the third consecutive year to receive the high rating.
