Spotlight: Nalco Champion

Throughout our childhood we've heard stories of heroes rescuing people in distress. Well, consider business and community partners as modern-day heroes who are answering the call from teachers both near and far. Business partners, such as Nalco Champion, provide schools with additional funding and resources to support teachers' efforts in engaging students in the classroom, augmenting basic skills instruction and enriching the overall classroom experience.

In keeping with its long-standing tradition of supporting public education, Nalco awarded 27 FBISD teachers with grants through the Ecolab Foundation's 2014 Visions for Learning grant program to support their instructional needs.

Following are only a few examples of FBISD's exceptional partnerships in action:

The **Sugar Land Rotary** donated \$30,000 to the Literacy Council of Fort Bend to fund a GED project at Fort Bend ISD's **Ridgemont Early Childhood Center**. The donation will help fund the project for the next five years. The Literacy Council has been in partnership with FBISD for the past three years. The organization began providing GED preparation classes at Ridgemont in September 2014. Currently, 15 adults take part in the evening classes that focus on the math, English Language Arts and civics portions of the test. The Sugar Land Rotary donation will fund five years of teacher compensation (at \$5,000 per year) and scholarship awards (\$1,000 per year for five years).

Briargate Elementary School students are benefiting from a health program funded by the **CPA's Helping School Committee of the Houston CPA Society**. The program benefits all 577 students, as well as teachers at the school.




How does our garden grow?... with support from enthusiastic business partners!

This year, the American Heart Association and the **Ridgemont Early Childhood Center** formed a budding new partnership to create an edible teaching garden on the campus grounds that will give students access to fresh fruits and vegetables, while teaching them the importance of healthy eating. AHA volunteers joined employees from **Reliant Energy** and **RMECC staff** this summer in constructing the garden.

The adult volunteers spent the day building garden bed boxes, loading soil into wheelbarrows and planting vegetable seedlings in time for the new school year. The AHA donated all the materials and supplies, including pallets of wood, an irrigation system, shovels, gloves, pruning shears, water hoses, buckets, as well as seeds and plants. The association also donated a digital camera for RMECC staff to document activity and progress made in the garden. AHA staff has made a two-year commitment to the school to help students maintain the garden.




