- Christopher Columbus brought over the first honeydew melon seeds to North America on his second expedition.
- 2 Cavaillon (a town in Provence, France) considers itself the world capital of melons.
- Although the flesh of the honeydew melon is typically green, there is a specific type that has orange flesh and is nicknamed the "temptation melon."
- In China, honeydew is called the Bailan or Wallace melon due to a visit by former U.S. Vice President Henry Wallace in the 1940s.

### Honeydew Skewers

#### Ingredients:

1 honeydew melon
(peeled, seeded, and cubed)
9 oz turkey slices
Fresh mint
1/4 cup lime juice

#### Directions:

Place melons in a bowl and coat with lime juice. Wrap turkey slices around melons and secure by placing a skewer through the melon. Repeat two or three times, topping I full skewer with fresh mint.
