2008 Texas Education Agency Accountability Ratings

How are the Accountability Ratings determined?

Under the state's accountability system, all campuses and school districts are assigned one of four ratings: exemplary, recognized, academically acceptable or academically unacceptable. The ratings include high school completion rates and middle school dropout rates, but are determined primarily by achievement levels on the Texas Assessment of Knowledge and Skills (TAKS) test in five student groups: (1) all students, (2) African-American, (3) Hispanic, (4) White and (5) economically disadvantaged.

TAKS Test Scores are up!

District scores on the TAKS tests are up compared to last year and compared to the state. An analysis of the accountability data shows that Fort Bend ISD reached "recognized" or "exemplary" on 20 of the 25 academic indicators.

Exemplary Rated Campuses

To be exemplary, a campus must have at least 90% of all students pass the standards for each subject; and a dropout rate of $\leq 2\%$ for middle schools or a completion rate of $\geq 95\%$ for high schools.

Recognized Rated Campuses

To be recognized, a campus must have at least 75% of all students pass the standards for each subject; and a dropout rate of $\leq 2\%$ for middle schools or a completion rate of $\geq 85\%$ for high schools.

District Accountability Rating:

- Academically Acceptable

Acceptable Rated Campuses

To be academically acceptable, a campus must have at least 70% of all students and groups passing the reading; and 65% for writing and social studies sections of TAKS; at least 50% of all students and groups passing math; at least 45% of all students and groups passing science; and a dropout rate of $\leq 2\%$ for middle schools or a completion rate of $\geq 75\%$ for high schools.
