Lesson 1: Everyday Bias


Lesson Overview: It seems like we are seeing more and more news and social media stories about people experiencing bias as they go about their daily lives—riding the subway, shopping in a store, dining in a restaurant and hanging out with friends. Indeed, the surge of such stories makes it seem like racism, sexism and other forms of bias and discrimination are becoming more pervasive.

In this lesson, students explore implicit and explicit bias and self-reflect about situations in which they have experienced or encountered everyday type of bias.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

- Students will understand what explicit and implicit bias is and provide examples.
- Students will reflect on situations in which they have experienced everyday bias, as either a target or a witness.
