#### Welcome to Theatre Arts!

Theatre Arts is an entertaining and creative art form. In order to be successful, we must be able to work well with others and take leadership roles when necessary. We all want to have an incredible school year, so let's look at the rules and procedures that will allow us to do so.

#### **Class Rules**

- 1. Be kind
- 2. Be responsible
- 3. Stay quiet when others are speaking
- 4. Stay seated at desk (when appropriate)
- \*\* Students will also follow all laws and school/district policies.

# **Consequences for disruptions/inappropriate behavior:**

□ 1st offense – Verbal Reminder
□ 2nd offense – Loss of privilege or other logical consequence; private conference with teacher
□ 3rd offense – Parent Contact and/or conference
□ 4th offense – Office Referral

Students with repeated behavior issues may not be allowed to attend after school events or field trips.

**Class Work and Grades:** All work is expected to be turned in on time and completed with integrity. No homework will be given, except absent or late work; however, students may be encouraged to rehearse their lines for a performance at home.

# Daily Grades:

- Bell Ringers
- Class work (notes, individual or group assignments, etc.)
- Vocabulary Quizzes
- Rehearsals
- Audience Etiquette
- Feedback

$\Box$ Bell ringer- students will complete a daily warm-up on paper or in Schoology during the first 5 minutes of class. This warm-up will usually relate to the current unit of study's vocabulary.
☐ Group work- all group members are expected to contribute. The teacher will evaluate group's work and students' grade will be determined by their individual contribution.
□ Rehearsals- students will be given adequate time to rehearse in preparation for any performance. During the rehearsal process, the teacher will monitor student progress. Students will be graded based on their own contribution to their group/individual performance. Students must make visible progress towards their end goal during EVERY rehearsal.
□ Audience Etiquette- students will be assessed on their individual behavior during their classmates' performances. Students are expected to remain quiet, seated, and focused on the performance. Nothing less than positivity and <u>constructive</u> feedback will be tolerated.
□ Feedback- Students will provide both peer feedback and self-feedback on projects and performances. Students will be expected to follow the RCS guidelines when giving feedback (respectful, constructive, specific.)
Major Grades:
<ul><li>Performances and Projects</li><li>Tests</li></ul>
□ Performances and Projects- performances and projects will ALWAYS be a major grade and will be graded according to a rubric that is co-created by the students and the teacher at the beginning of each project. Students will be given adequate class time to prepare for all major grade assignments and will not be required to work on them outside of class (unless the assignment is late).
□ Tests- tests will include multiple choice/ written tests that reinforce theatrical concepts and vocabulary, as well as line memorization tests.
Absent/Late Work
☐ If a student is absent, it is their responsibility to make up any work they missed. Students can find their missing work in the "Absent Work" bin and Schoology. Students will have 1 extra day to complete their assignments per day they were absent.
☐ Late work is will not be accepted after the Report Card date.

#### Other Class Procedures

□ Cell phones- all cell phones are expected to be left in the students backpack throughout the entire class period and will not be allowed to use them. Students should not be texting **anyone** during class as per campus policy. If a student's phone is taken up by the teacher, they will get it back at the end of the day from the office and receive an office referral. The school policy states that there will be a \$15 fine to get a student's phone from the office on the third confiscation. Students are allowed to charge their phone during class but must leave it on the charger until the end of the period.

□ Hall Passes- students are expected to plan out their day wisely and use the restroom during passing period. However, students will be allowed to use the restroom during class in the case of an emergency. Students will not be permitted to leave the classroom during the first ten minutes or last ten minutes of class, as per district policy (unless in the case of an emergency.) Students may receive a nurse or counselor pass whenever they need it.

□ Food and Drink- food and drink are NOT allowed in the classroom, except water, as it can cause a distraction and leave a mess. In theatre, we spend a lot of time on our feet and performing, and food does not really have a place in this setting.


