**HOMEWORK:** Students will receive homework almost every night. Homework must be completed thoroughly in order to reinforce and master the content. Daily homework grades are given on a work shown and completion basis and will not be accepted late. Four daily homework assignments will consist of one Homework Check Daily Grade, meaning that if a student completes all four, she/he will get a 100. THIS MEANS THAT COMPLETING HOMEWORK WILL BOOST A STUDENT'S GRADE. (Extra Credit) Homework assignments are posted in the classroom as well as on Schoology.

I understand the homework policy above and expect to complete my homework out of four days on a regular basis.

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**GRADING:** 50% of your child's grade will be based on Daily Grades. Daily Grades consist of Homework Checks, Graded Assignments, and Quizzes. We will have a quiz or graded assignment almost every week. The other 50% will come from Major Grades, which are tests and occasionally projects. I will take at least 6 Daily Grades and 3 Major grades every nine weeks.

**TESTING AND RE-TESTING:** The 6<sup>th</sup> Grade Math Team at DCMS wants to ensure our students are mastering the TEKS as outlined by the district. We implement a Progressive Testing policy, so ALL students will have the opportunity to show deeper understanding of tested concepts on subsequent tests. In a single grading period, Test 1 will be all new material. Test 2 will be 50% new material and 50% material from Test 1. If a student scores higher on Test 2 than Test 1, the Test 2 grade will replace the Test 1 score. Test 3 will be 50% new material and 50% material from Test 2. If a student scores higher on Test 3 than Test 2, the Test 3 grade will replace the Test 2 score.

**LATE WORK AND ABSENCES:** Daily homework needs to be done in a thorough and timely manner and brought back to class complete every day.
