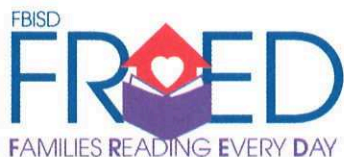

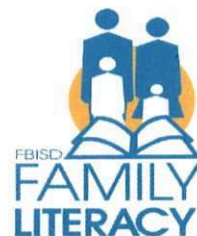

The Latino and African American Family Stories are designed to establish familiar reading routines for parents and children. Each Family Reading program is designed to be an educational process that encourages critical reflection and dialogue through reading, writing, and art projects. This program is implemented every semester and is designed for the whole family.
