
History

- The school started out as Houston College for Negroes. On June 1st 1951 the school named was changed to Texas Southern University. The students that attended petitioned the legislature for the phrase "Negroes" to be removed from the name of the school.



Subsidized - Government pays interest while enrolled in at least 6 hours or more.

Unsubsidized - Student responsible for interest. Must be enrolled in 6 hours or more.

Parent Plus - Allow parents to help pay for a child's college through a Fixed Rate Federal Loan.

WHAT'S THE TIGER PROMISE?

The Tiger Promise is a tuition guarantee program for eligible students. This is our commitment to supporting students by covering tuition and mandatory fees, as long as they meet specific academic progress benchmarks. This program is designed for Texas residents who meet specific eligibility requirements. The financial aid office does this through gift aid such as grants and scholarships.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

To qualify for the Tiger Promise Program, you need to meet these criteria:

- 1. You MUST be a Texas resident
- 2. This program is available to only FIRST TIME FRESHMEN and NEW TRANSFER STUDENTS.
- You must meet priority application deadlines.
 - For students starting in the spring, your deadline was October 1.
 - For students starting in fall 2025, you must complete your admissions application no later than March 1st.
 - Submit your FAFSA or TAFSA by April 1st for the full semester.
- This is also based on your family's annual income.
 It must be less than \$125,000, based on Pell Grant eligibility, far you to qualify.



What Does the Program Cover?

For eligible first-time freshmen and first-time transfers, the Tiger Promise covers tuition and mandatory fees up to 4 years to include winter and summer semesters dependent upon degree program.

WHAT'S THE POST 9/11 GI BILL

• THE POST-9/11 GI BILL HELPS YOU PAY FOR SCHOOL OR COVER EXPENSES WHILE YOU'RE TRAINING FOR A JOB. IF YOU'VE SERVED ON ACTIVE DUTY AFTER SEPTEMBER 10, 2001, YOU MAY QUALIFY FOR THE POST-9/11 GI BILL.



AT LEAST ONE OF THESE MUST BE TRUE:

- YOU SERVED AT LEAST 90 DAYS ON ACTIVE DUTY (EITHER ALL AT ONCE OR WITH BREAKS IN SERVICE) ON OR AFTER SEPTEMBER 11, 2001, OR
- YOU SERVED FOR AT LEAST 30 CONTINUOUS DAYS (ALL AT ONCE, WITHOUT A BREAK IN SERVICE) ON OR AFTER SEPTEMBER 11, 2001, AND WERE HONORABLY DISCHARGED WITH A SERVICE-CONNECTED DISABILITY, OR
- YOU'RE A DEPENDENT CHILD USING BENEFITS TRANSFERRED BY A QUALIFYING VETERAN OR SERVICE MEMBER





BENEFITS CONTINUED... POST 9/11 G. I. BILL

- COVERS UP TO 100% OF TUITION AND FEES FOR PUBLIC COLLEGES.
- MONTHLY HOUSING ALLOWANCE FOR ELIGIBLE MEMBERS.
- UP TO \$1,000/YEAR FOR BOOKS AND SUPPLIES.





Montgomery GI Bill (MGIB-SR)

- Earn up to \$400/month for up to 36 months while in school.
- Available to members of the Selected Reserve, including Army Reserve.





PART-TIME PAY FOR SERVICE:

 EARN COMPETITIVE PAY FOR ONE WEEKEND A MONTH AND TWO WEEKS OF ANNUAL TRAINING.

EXAMPLE:

STARTING AT \$238/MONTH FOR DRILL WEEKENDS AS A PRIVATE (E-1).

U.S. ARMY STANDARD TRAINING PROGRAM

Requirements...

- Must be will to join the US Army
- Must be 17yrs old
- Must complete Junior year of High School
- Must get parent(s) permission to join
- Must be in good moral standing
- Must meet mental/physical health requirements

INTRODUCTION TO STANDARD TRAINING

- The foundation for every enlisted soldier
- Ensures readiness, discipline, and skill development
- Includes Basic Combat Training (BCT), Advanced Individual Training (AIT), and additional specialized training

PHASE 1: BASIC COMBAT TRAINING (BCT)

BOOT CAMP

- 10-week program for new soldiers
- FOCUSES ON PHYSICAL FITNESS, DISCIPLINE, AND MILITARY SKILLS
- TRAINING INCLUDES WEAPONS HANDLING, TEAMWORK, AND ARMY VALUES

PHASE 2: ADVANCED INDIVIDUAL TRAINING (AIT)

ARMY JOB TRAINING

- Specialized training based on Military Occupational Specialty (MOS)

 Length varies from a few weeks to several months Prepares soldiers for their specific roles in the Army

ADDITIONAL TRAINING PROGRAMS

Airborne, Ranger,
 Special Forces,
 and leadership
 courses

 Ongoing professional development opportunities

- Ensures soldiers maintain readiness and expertise




