CURRICULUM

- Kempner provides a strong academic program with more than 200 possible course selections including an extensive vocational/technical curriculum.
- Dual credit English, college algebra and psychology are offered to students on campus during the regular school day. Students have the opportunity to take additional dual credit courses at the community college on their own time during the school year.
- Twenty-four Advanced Placement courses are available in English, Calculus, Statistics, Chemistry, Biology, Physics, Studio Art, U.S. History, Psychology, Government, Economics, Spanish, Environmental Science and Computer Science.
- UIL-sponsored athletic programs for young men and women are offered in football, basketball, tennis, track, soccer, golf, swimming, volleyball, baseball, softball and diving.
- Co-curricular programs include choir, band, orchestra, drill team, student government, service and academic clubs, athletics and Academic Decathlon and Destination Imagination.
- Gifted and Talented programs are available in English, Math, Science and Social Studies.
- The honors program offers courses in English, Math, Science, Social Studies, World Languages, Art and Career and Technical Education.
- Instruction is available for special needs through Special Education and Bilingual/ESOL instruction.
