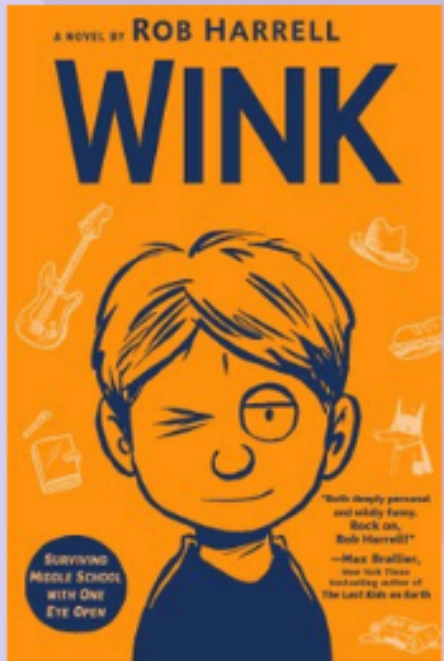
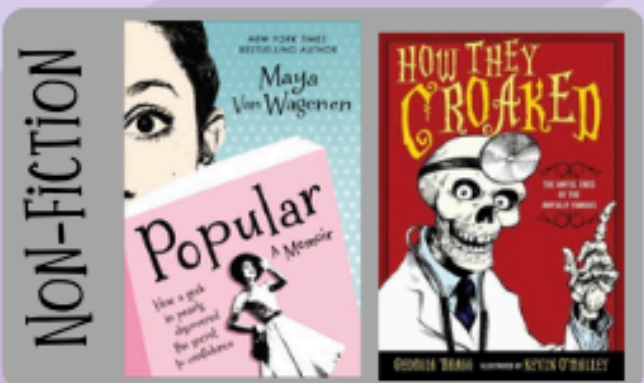

Research shows that **students can maintain or improve reading skills** when they are out of school for the summer.

Access to books over the summer increases reading opportunities and enjoyment of books, and **helps students be ready for next school year.**

Students who read **at least five books** during the summer can maintain important literacy skills.

While the district does not require summer reading, it is highly encouraged to prevent the summer slide and keep your student's academic skills sharp. This is a great time to foster a love of reading as well, so let them read anything they are interested in as long as it is something they haven't read before and is age appropriate. All types of reading count- don't scoff at their preference for audio books or graphic novels. Both trigger wonderful connections in the brain.
