

FAFSA/TASFA Updates

FAFSA or TASFA?

- FAFSA: For federal financial aid
- FAFSA: Students who are citizens or eligible noncitizens (U.S. national, permanent resident, T-visa, or individual who has an I-94) and have a Social Security Number
- TASFA: For state (or institutional) financial aid
- o TASFA: Students who are Texas residents
 - Lived in TX 3 years by the time of HS graduation

Graduation Requirement

- FAFSA/TASFA will open December 1
 - If you have "completed" the FAFSA, you have completed the wrong application*
- State Financial Aid Priority Deadline: February 15th

Create Your FSA ID

- Your FSA ID is your legal signature and shouldn't be created or used by anyone other than you. You will need this every year you fill out a FAFSA and for the lifetime of your loans, if applicable
 SAVE YOUR LOGIN INFORMATION!
- Parents will need to create an FSA ID. No duplicates.





College Career and Military Readiness

The Texas Education Agency (TEA) has defined a set of indicators that students can earn to be considered college, career, or military-ready. Students who meet ONE of these CCMR indicators are considered "CCMR-met."

CCMR "met" determines whether a student takes a remedial class in college, has work-related skills and interests, and has potential success in the military, or uses the industry-based certification to improve overall employability straight out of high school.

ADMISSION ESSAY PROMPTS

Apply Texas Topic A	Tell us your story. What unique opportunities or challenges have you experienced throughout your high school career that have shaped who you are today?
Common App Prompt 1	Some student have a background, identity, interest or talent that is so meaningful they believe their application would be incomplete without it. If this sounds like you, then please share your story.
Common App Prompt 2	The lessons we take from obstacles we encounter can be fundamental to later success. Recount a time when you faced a challenge, setback or failure. How did it affect you, and what did you learn from the experience?
Common App Prompt 3	Reflect on a time when you questioned or challenged a belief or idea. What prompted your thinking? What was the outcome?
Common App Prompt 5	Discuss an accomplishment, event or realization that sparked a period of personal growth and a new understanding of yourself or others.




