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SCHOOL DISTRICT AND COMMUNITY

John Foster Dulles is the flagship school out of the eleven high schools total in the Fort Bend Independent School District. Opened in 1959, Dulles currently serves students from several areas including the cities of Meadows Place, Missouri City, and Sugar Land. Located in the northeast part of Fort Bend County just southwest of Houston, ours is a community whose strengths lie in a diversity of cultural, ethnic, and socioeconomic groups.

SCHOOL INFORMATION

- 2020– 2021 School Year - Seniors: 665, Juniors: 671, Sophomores: 673, Freshman: 661
- Faculty: 177 teachers – 45% have Master’s degrees and beyond
- Schedule: Classes meet 60-90 minutes per day, maximum 4 periods per day, 5 days each week, 18 weeks per semester.
- Due to COVID-19, the first six weeks of the school year were conducted fully online using synchronous and asynchronous learning.
- School Year: August 17, 2020 to May 26, 2021
- Accreditation: Southern Association of Secondary Schools and the Texas Education Agency

CURRICULUM

- Dulles provides a strong academic program with more than 200 possible course selections including an extensive vocational/technical curriculum and options to earn college credit during the school year through 31 Advanced Placement courses.
- UIL-sponsored athletic programs are offered in football, basketball, tennis, track, soccer, golf, swimming, volleyball, baseball, softball and cross-country.
- Co-curricular programs include choir, band, orchestra, drill team, student government, service and academic clubs, athletics and Academic Decathlon and Destination Imagination.
- The Gifted and Talented program offers courses in English, Math, Science, Social Studies, Foreign Languages, and Fine Arts.
- Dulles has been home to the FBISD Math & Science Academy since 2010. Bringing students that are interested in mathematics and science together from all parts of FBISD allows us to offer a unique high school experience where students have access to math and science curricula typically not available until the university level.

CLASS RANK

- All high school credit courses attempted are included in the calculation of the GPA
- The GPA system utilized in FBISD is referred to as the “100 Point Scale”
- GPA is calculated by adding semester averages earned and dividing by semesters attempted
- Courses are weighted differently in GPA calculations used for class rank
- Grade points are assessed based on the grade and level as follows:
