SCHOOL DISTRICT AND COMMUNITY

Almeta Crawford High School is the 12th high school in the Fort Bend Independent School District. Opened in 2023, Almeta Crawford serves students in parts of Sienna, Rosharon, and Fresno. This community is located adjacent to Southwest Houston and has grown significantly in the last ten years to become a major suburban area. In its inaugural year, 2023-2024, Almeta Crawford consisted of 9th and 10th grade, with the first graduating class expected to be the class of 2026.

CURRICULUM

- Almeta Crawford provides a strong academic program with more than 200 possible course selections including an extensive vocational/technical curriculum.
- Several options are available for students to earn college credit during the school day.
- There are 23 Advanced Placement courses available in 2-D Art and Design, 3-D Art and Design, Biology, Calculus AB, Calculus BC, Chemistry, Computer Science A, Drawing, English Language and Composition, English Literature and Composition, Environmental Science, Human Geography, Macroeconomics, Physics 1, Physics 2, Precalculus, Psychology, Seminar, Spanish Language and Culture, Statistics, United States Government and Politics, United States History, and World History: Modern.
- UIL-sponsored athletic programs for young men and women are offered in baseball, basketball, cheerleading, cross country, diving, football, golf, soccer, softball, swimming, tennis, track and field, volleyball and water polo.
- Co-curricular programs include choir, band, orchestra, dance team, student council, service and academic clubs, athletics, and Academic Decathlon.
- Gifted and Talented programs are available in English, Math, Social Studies and Science.
- Instruction is available for students with special needs through the Special Education and Bilingual/ESL programs.

GPA AND CLASS RANK

- The District records a weighted 100-point scale, weighted 4.0 scale, and the unweighted 4.0 GPA on student transcripts. All Courses recorded on the academic achievement record (high school transcript), with the exception of courses taken on a GPA-exempt basis, shall count toward GPA and class rank using the grades received. These courses shall be weighted by category when calculating GPA. Any courses taken in fulfillment of an endorsement are not excluded from GPA.
 - AAC/Honors: 5 Point GPA Weight
 - AP, Beyond AP, Dual Credit, & On Ramps: 10 GPA Weight
 - A: 100-90, B: 89-80, C: 79-70, F: 69 & Below
- EIC Local Policy states that "The District shall provide to each student notice of the student's percentile/quartile and class rank containing the student's specific numeric rank out of the specific total class size as determined the day rank is run as outlined in administrative procedures. The class rank and percentile/quartile for a graduating student shall not be officially reported on the student's academic achievement record." Students in a Program of Choice shall be ranked with the students at the high school within the attendance boundary in which they reside.
