

Hodges Bend Middle School 6th Grade Math Syllabus

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Course Description:

The primary focal areas of seventh grade mathematics are numbers and operations; proportionality; expressions, equations, and relationships; and measurement and data. Students will apply operations with rational numbers to problem situations and continue to develop their understanding of proportionality. Emphasis will be placed on developing algebraic reasoning through the study of expressions, equations, and mathematical relationships. Students will communicate these relationships using verbal, graphic, numeric, and symbolic representations of equations and inequalities. Students will continue their study of statistics to include probability, making predictions and determining solutions to problems. Students will use appropriate statistics, representations of data, and reasoning to draw conclusions, evaluate arguments, and make recommendations. A personal financial literacy component will offer the opportunity for students to apply problem solving and develop economic thinking.



GRADING:

The breakdown of a student's average grade will be determined as follows:

- Classwork, Homework, Quizzes, and Daily Participation–50%

Participation

Participation is based on positive contributions to classroom activities as well as bringing your materials daily. Active participation consists of the following: asking appropriate questions, giving answers respectfully, contributing to discussions and teamwork skills. Students may conduct cuts due to disruptive behavior, tardiness, and inattentiveness.

Classwork/Homework

Students are to complete classwork when assigned. As the teacher, I will be actively monitoring students to make sure students are on task and I will be there to answer any questions they may have.

Assignments are to be turned in by the due date. <u>All classwork/homework assignments</u> not turned in when due are considered late and will lose five points everyday it is turned

in, for up to three days, per FBISD Policy. After 3 days, acceptance of late work is at the teacher's discretion.

Classwork submitted in Schoology must be submitted by the date and time listed. Homework consists of completing 7 Dreambox Lessons each week (Sunday-Saturday). Each week, a report is run, and if the student has completed 7 or more Dreambox Lessons, they will receive a Daily Grade of 100. Less than 7 lessons are a 50, and 0 lessons will receive a 0.

Tests/Quizzes:

Quizzes are daily grades, while tests are major grades. Students can retest if they score less than 70 percent.

Cheating and Plagiarism

Any student found to be cheating on an independent assignment/test, found guilty of plagiarism, and/or any types of deception for credit will result in a zero for that assignment. The parent/guardian of the student will be contacted.

Absences & Tardies

Regular attendance at school is extremely important! Please do what you can to be at school every day. Any missed work because of an absence will have one day per absence to be made up. For extended absences, parents need to contact me or call the front office and arrange to pick up missed work. If a test is missed due to an absence from class, the student will need to see me to arrange a time to test.

Students are expected to follow all school rules, classroom expectations, and procedures every day. Failure to comply results in the following:


- Verbal Warning
