Hello Young Scientists! Welcome to the wonderful world of Biology! I will be your instructor this year and I am very excited about meeting each and every one of you. My mission as your teacher is to lead you all to encounter experiences and knowledge that will broaden your mind about the world of Biology.

Course Overview

In Pre-AP Biology, students conduct field and laboratory investigations, use scientific methods during investigations and make informed decisions using critical thinking and scientific problem solving on various biological topics. This is a faster-paced, more challenging course than would be offered in general biology. It is designed to guide students in the investigation of all aspects of living organisms and prepare students for the Advanced Placement Biology course students may decide to take junior or senior year.

Students will be taking the <u>Biology STAAR exam</u> at the end of this school year in May. This is a REQUIRED state exam and is necessary for graduation from high school.

Classroom Procedures

- **DO NOW!**: As soon as students enter the room they are to complete their DO NOW exercise. This is a **TIMED** assignment and can be worth a daily grade.
- Tardies: Online: Students are tardy if they have not logged on to the class when the class starts.

 In Person: Tardy is defined as not being seated working on the DO NOW when the bell rings. Students who are tardy to class must sign in at the tardy station. Parents will be notified after the 2nd tardy. After 4 or more tardies, the student may be given detention and/ or referred to an administrator. Tardies can also negatively affect the student's participation grade on the TIMED DO NOW at the beginning of the class.
- Absences: Absent students have 3 days to <u>receive and return</u> make-up work to the teacher after they have returned to school. <u>Students must have an excused absence in order to receive make-up work.</u> Missed work can also be accessed through Schoology.
- Late Work: Late work will be accepted with a 10% reduction in grade for each day the assignment is late up to 5 days. After 5 days, the assignment will no longer be accepted and the student will receive a "0" for the assignment.
- Make-up Work: Make-up work is only given to students who have EXCUSED absences ONLY! Make-up work is not for students who chose not to turn in assignments. Make-up work is NOT to be discussed during class time but after school or students may access the assignments needed through Schoology.
- The Science Lab: Students can ONLY participate in the science lab if they have returned a signed safety contract and have received a 100% on their safety exam. Students cannot participate in laboratory until these requirements are met.
- **Restroom Procedure:** I encourage students to go to the restroom BEFORE class. If it is an emergency, students will be allowed to go to the restroom but **not during the first and last 10 minutes of class.**

- **Detention:** If a student is assigned detention, they must attend the detention on Tuesday afternoon in my classroom.
- ➤ <u>Cell Phone Policy:</u> Cell phones are used in the classroom for instructional purposed often. However, CELL PHONES CAN ONLY BE USED WITH THE TEACHER'S PERMISSION. Lack of responsible use of cell phones will result in consequences as stated by the district cell phone policy.
