OVERVIEW:

The primary goal of the English IV Advanced Course is to develop the skills necessary for students to write and read effectively in their college courses and across the curriculum. This course will provide you with an in-depth study of British Literature. Written assignments, both short and long-term, will play a significant role in the course. Students are expected to read critically, think analytically and write clearly.

RULES:

GRADES:

Major Grades 50%: Tests will measure the student's knowledge of the material covered in class separated into units. Writing assignments range from responding to a question previously discussed in class, the reader's preference of the selected reading assignment, and simple types of essays preparing the student for state mandated and college entrance exams.

Daily Grades 50%: Grammar activities, vocabulary work, class participation, and group work are daily grades. Journals will be used to take notes, learn new vocabulary, review grammar and complete in-class writing assignments.

LATE WORK POLICY:

MAKE-UP WORK POLICY:
