SCHOOL DISTRICT AND COMMUNITY

Fort Bend Independent School District is located in the northeast part of Fort Bend County, immediately southwest of Houston and Harris County. The Fort Bend Independent School District encompasses the incorporated cities of Missouri City, Sugar Land, Arcola, Meadows, and a small portion of Houston. It covers 174 square miles. Within the district are 47 elementary schools (K-5), 14 middle schools (6-8), 11 senior high schools (9-12), 3 alternative high schools, and the Technical Education Center.

SCHOOL INFORMATION:

- Seniors: 565, Juniors: 551, Sophomores: 540, Freshman: 611
- Faculty: 158 – 23% have master's degrees and beyond
- Schedule: Classes meet 50 minutes per day, maximum 7 periods per day, 5 days each week, 18 weeks per semester.
- School Year: August 11, 2021 to May 26, 2022
- Accreditation: Southern Association of Secondary Schools and the Texas Education Agency

CURRICULUM

- Austin has strong academic programs with more than 200 possible course selections including an extensive vocational-technical curriculum, electives in art, speech, drama, journalism, music, foreign languages, math, English, science, and social studies.
- UIL sponsored athletic programs for young men and women.
- Co-curricular programs include choir, band, orchestra, dance team, student government, service and academic clubs, athletics, and academic decathlon.
- College entrance testing and scholarship clearinghouse are available through counselors.
- Students participate in a wide selection of vocational offerings both at the Fort Bend James Reese Career and Technical Center and on the Austin Campus.
- Over 34 College Board Approved Advanced Placement courses offered in math, science, English, social studies, foreign languages, and fine arts & 19 Pre AP/ Honors classes.
- Instruction is available for special needs through Special Education, ESOL Instruction, and Gifted and Talented classes.
- School year is August 11, 2021 through May 26, 2022.
- Austin is on a nine-week grading cycle.
- Access to on-line, real time grades and attendance.

CLASS RANK

- All high school credit courses attempted are included in the calculation of the GPA
 - The GPA system utilized in FBISD is referred to as the "100 Point Scale"
 - GPA is calculated by adding semester averages earned and dividing by semesters attempted
 - Courses are weighted differently in GPA calculations used for class rank
 - Grade points are assessed based on the grade and level as follows:
 - Advanced Placement/Beyond AP 10 Point GPA Weight
 - Pre-AP and Dual Credit Courses 5 Point GPA Weight
