SCHOOL DISTRICT AND COMMUNITY

Fort Bend Independent School District is located in the Northeast port of Fort Bend County, immediately Southwest of Houston & Harris County. FBISD encompasses the incorporated cities of Missouri City, Sugar Land, Arcola, Meadows, Richmond, and a small portion of Houston. It covers 174 square miles. Within the district are 51 elementary schools (K-5), 15 middle schools (6-8), 12 senior high schools (9-12), an Alternative high school, and a Technical Education Center.

SCHOOL INFORMATION:

- Seniors: 546, Juniors: 595, Sophomores: 673, Freshman: 743
- Faculty: 133– 29% have master's degrees and beyond (2023 data)
- Schedule: Classes meet 50 minutes per day, maximum 7 periods per day, 5 days each week, 18 weeks per semester.
- School Year: August 8, 2024 to May 29, 2025
- Accreditation: Southern Association of Secondary Schools and the Texas Education Agency.

CURRICULUM

- Austin has a strong academic program with more than 200 possible course selections including an extensive vocational/technical curriculum.
- Options are available for students to earn college credit during the school day.
- UIL-sponsored athletic programs for young men and women offered in football, cross country, basketball, tennis, track, soccer, golf, swimming, volleyball, baseball, softball, water polo and diving.
- Co-curricular programs include choir, band, orchestra, drill team, student government, service and academic clubs, athletics and Academic Decathlon and Destination Imagination.
- College entrance testing and scholarship clearinghouse are available through counselors.
- Students participate in a wide selection of vocational offerings both at the Fort Bend James Reese Career and Technical Center and on the Austin Campus.
- Twenty-seven College Board Approved Advanced Placement courses offered in math, science, English, social studies, foreign languages, and fine arts & 10 AAC Classes.
- Instruction is available for special needs through Special Education, ESOL Instruction, and Gifted and Talented classes.
- Austin is on a nine-week grading cycle.
- Access to on-line, real-time grades and attendance is available to all students and families.
- Post high school planning, college & scholarship information available through our CCR.

GPA AND CLASS RANK

- The District records a weighted 100-point scale, weighted 4.0 scale, and the unweighted 4.0 GPA on student transcripts. All Courses recorded on the academic achievement record (high school transcript), with the exception of courses taken on a GPA-exempt basis, shall count toward GPA and class rank using the grades received. These courses shall be weighted by category when calculating GPA. Any courses taken in fulfillment of an endorsement are not excluded from GPA.
 - AAC/Honors: 5 Point GPA Weight
 - AP, Beyond AP, Dual Credit, & On Ramps: 10 GPA Weight
 - A: 100-90, B: 89-80, C: 79-70, F: 69 & Below
- EIC Local Policy states that "The District shall provide to each student notice of the student's percentile/quartile and class rank containing the student's specific numeric rank out of the specific total class size as determined the day rank is run as outlined in administrative procedures. The class rank and percentile/quartile for a graduating student shall not be officially reported on the student's academic achievement record."
