SCHOOL DISTRICT AND COMMUNITY

Fort Bend Independent School District is located in the Northeast port of Fort Bend County, immediately Southwest of Houston & Harris County. FBISD encompasses the incorporated cities of Missouri City, Sugar Land, Arcola, Meadows, Richmond, and a small portion of Houston. It covers 174 square miles. Within the district are 51 elementary schools (K-5), 15 middle schools (6-8), 11 senior high schools (9-12), an Alternative high school, and a Technical Education Center.
