Course Description

Students enrolled in English 6 continue to increase and refine their reading, writing, listening, speaking, vocabulary, and critical thinking skills. Students write in a variety of forms and edit their papers for clarity, engaging academic language, and the correct use of the conventions and mechanics of written English. We will work towards students taking ownership of their own learning through progress monitoring and student-teacher conferences. Students will work collaboratively online to demonstrate the mastery of TEKS and increase the skills of a 21st century learner.

How do I Enter the Virtual Classroom Each Day?

- > Each synchronous learning session will be held using Microsoft Teams.
- > Directions:
 - >Choose your class from Teams.
 - >Choose the calendar.
 - >Click "Join" at your scheduled class time.
 - >Enter the classroom with your camera on and the microphone on mute.

How do I Manage the Asynchronous Assignments?

- >Access the asynchronous assignments in Schoology in the folder labeled "Asynchronous Learning" for each week.
- > Asynchronous assignments are due by 11:59PM on the date the assignment is due.

What Happens if I Turn in an Assignment Late?

- > After the due date has passed, students should email or use the messenger in Schoology to inform the teacher the assignment has been turned in.
- >If on campus, place late assignment in designated location.*

How Do I Check My Grade?
