Where and when does the GT Mentorship Seminar class meet?

- Fort Bend ISD Administration Annex – 3119 Sweetwater Blvd., Sugar Land, TX
- Tuesdays 5:00 – 7:00 p.m.
- Thursdays EITHER 4:30 – 6:00 p.m. OR 6:00 – 7:30 p.m.
- 1 ½ weekly hours are asynchronous.

Is this a for-credit course?

- Yes. This course is an honors-level elective, weighted like an AAC course.

Do I have to find my own mentor?

- You must take an active role in finding leads, but we handle the outreach.

Is there a cost or fee involved?

- There is no course fee. Any expenses related to the mentorship are the responsibility of the student. Some examples include uniform pieces (scrubs, lab coat, branded shirt), parking, tolls, etc.

Frequently Asked Questions (cont'd)

What if I don't drive or have my own car?

- You are not required to drive or have your own car, but it is strongly recommended.
- You are required to provide your own transportation to class, to interviews, and to your mentorship site.
- We do our best to find a mentor in the area, **but that is not a guarantee.**
- Transportation excuses are not accepted for tardiness or non-attendance at a mentorship-related requirement.

Frequently Asked Questions (cont'd)

I am involved in a lot of extracurricular activities and clubs.
Should I still apply?

- We do our best to be as flexible as possible, including offering the Thursday flex time.
- If you are in activities that require DAILY practice or rehearsal (band, theater, dance, athletics, etc.), please be thoughtful about your time management skills.
- Because this is a for-credit course, we can work out a shared schedule so students can participate in activities and in GT Mentorship.

- **Written Application AND Face-to-Face Interview***

*Interviews will take place on your campus during the regular school day.

- **Grades/GPA are not considered in the selection process.**

- **Application Window: January 31 – February 8, 2026**

The application link will be posted on the GT Mentorship Web Page

- **Interview Windows: February 17-20; February 23-27; and March 2-5, 2026**

- **Decision Letters: March 27, 2026**

Required Events

Students who accept the invitation to enroll in the GT Mentorship Program will be required to attend two events:

- **Class of 2027 Orientation** – Wednesday, April 15, 2026, 6:00 p.m.
Students must attend with at least one parent.
- **Class of 2026 Showcase** – Tuesday, April 28, 2026. 6:00 p.m.
