#### Mindfulness & Neuroscience for Mental Wellness with Anita Thomas and Katie Austin



He is a graduate of Texas A&M University. For almost twenty five years David has been a teacher of diverse student populations. His passion is working with students in gifted education. In 2011 he was recognized as the Texas State Teacher of the Year for the Gifted by the Texas Association for the Gifted and Talented. He continues to teach middle school English Language Arts because "when you find your bliss, why would you do anything else." David has spoken to numerous school districts about gifted education. Away from school you can find him building and designing puzzles for escape rooms, and dabbling in building furniture for his wife and three children.
