

Daily Protocols

Students will:

- ❖ Write down Learning Intentions and Success Criteria
- ❖ Write down Daily Science Warm up in correct area of interactive science notebook (ISN)
- ❖ Have interactive science notebook (ISN) and pencil daily



ASSIGNMENT POLICY

- Dates for major grades and some daily grades will be posted on website, newsletters, and in classroom
- Work that is turned in late may have 10 points per day deducted up to 3 days
- After 3 days student will not receive credit for the assignment.
- Students are required to keep up with all due dates for assignments (parents may also check website for due dates for long term assignments)
- Students are required to write down all homework assignments



ABSENCE POLICY

- It is the student's responsibility to collect any missed assignment.
- Each student will be given the number of days absent to turn in the missing work. For example, if a student misses three days, they will get three days to complete the missed assignment.
- If a student is absent the day an assignment is due, they must turn the assignment on the day they return to school.



CLASSROOM EXPECTATIONS

To maintain a positive learning environment, the following classroom expectations are in place:

- Follow the Respect Agreement created by the class
- Follow all lab safety rules and the provided lab guidelines
- Turn in all assignments by their due dates
- Pass the lab safety test and sign safety contract
