Advanced World History



Course Outline

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Course Focus:

World History is a required course. This course covers beginnings of civilization, classical era, post classical era, connecting hemispheres, absolutism and revolution, and the modern era.

Emphasis is placed on challenging students' critical thinking and problem-solving skills. This is done through the use of analysis of primary source documents, graphic data, and political cartoons, as well as other activities. Students demonstrate their knowledge by completing daily assignments, quizzes, tests, and projects.

Interactive Student Notebooks

The Interactive Student Notebook (ISN) is a required and important part of World History and should be brought to class daily. When completed, ALL assignments will be placed in the ISN.

Class Procedures:

- Copy the essential question, success criteria and complete "Warm Up" activity in ISN every day.
- It is your responsibility to get any work you missed while absent.
- <u>Missed assignments</u> from an absence must be made up within the number of days equal to the absence.
- <u>Late assignments</u> will be accepted up to 5 days after original due date. Each day is a 10 point deduction. Maximum: 5 days-50 point deduction.

Grading:
