FBISD has determined the following absence codes for holy days listed below. Therefore, days that will be considered a "funded absence" will have "REL" in the attendance code column.

August 2021

Date	Observanc e	Description	Absence Code	Comment
August 18-19	ASHURA	Islamic A day of fasting observed on the 10th day of the month of Muharram to celebrate Moses' exodus from Egypt. For Shi'a Muslims, it also marks the climax of the ten-day Remembrance of Muharram, which mourns the martyrdom of Hussein at the Battle of Kerbala in 680 CE.	REL	*Begins on the evening of August 18 th and ends the evening of August 19 th . August 19th is REL.

Date	Observance	Description	Absence Code	Comment
September 6-8	ROSH HASHANAH	Jewish Beginning of the Jewish New Year and first of the High Holy Days, which marks the beginning of a ten-day period of penitence and spiritual renewal.	REL	Begins on the evening of September 6 th and ends the evening of September 8th . September 7th - 8th is REL
September 15-16	YOM KIPPUR	Jewish The "Day of Atonement" marks the end of the Ten Days of Penitence that begin with Rosh Hashanah.	REL

*September 20-27	SUKKOT	Jewish The week-long "Feast of Booths" commemorates the 40-year wandering of the Israelites in the desert on the way to the Promised Land.	Excused/Unexcused	If students are absent during the week, absences would be considered excused/unexcused.
September 27-29	SHEMINI ATZERET	Jewish "The Eighth (Day) of Assembly" is observed on the day immediately following Sukkot.	REL

October 7-15	NAVARATRI	Hindu Nine-day festival celebrating the triumph of good over evil. It worships God in the form of the universal mother commonly referred to as Durga, Devi or Shakti, and marks the start of fall.	Excused/Unexcused	Observance not generally requiring student absence
October 19	MAWLID AL-NABI (Also known as MILAD AL-NABI)	Islamic (Shi'a) The observance of the birthday of Islam founder Prophet Muhammad, which is celebrated in Rabi' alawwal, the third month in the Islamic calendar. Sunni Muslims celebrate it five days earlier than Shi'a Muslims.	REL

November 7	BIRTH OF BAHÁ'U'LLÁH	Bahá'í Observance of the anniversary of the birth in 1817 of Bahá'u'lláh.	REL	
November 19	GURU NANAK DEV JI'S BIRTHDAY	Sikh A very important holiday in the Sikh faith as Guru Nanak Dev's was the First Guru of the Sikhs and the Founder of Sikhism. the holiday is celebrated according to the lunar date.	REL

April 2- May 1	RAMADAN	Islamic Observed by Muslims worldwide as a month of fasting to commemorate the first revelation of the Qur'an to the Prophet Muhammad.	Excused/Unexcused	Observance not generally requiring student absence
April 10	RAMA NAVAMI	Hindu Celebrates the birthday of Rama, king of ancient India, hero of the epic Ramayana, and seventh incarnation of Vishnu.	REL	
April 14	VAISAKHI (also spelled Baisakhi)	Sikh The festival that celebrates the founding of the Sikh community as the Khalsa (community of the initiated).
