Gifted and Talented Services in Fort Bend ISD





2018 – 2019 Course Selection for GT Students: PRE-AP and AP!

As your child begins to complete their course selection for 2018-2019, it is important to remember GT students grades 6-12 must be enrolled in Pre-AP and AP classes.

Your child's area of identification determines **which** Advanced Level courses they should select. Students in the GT MATH and SCIENCE Program, must enroll in a Pre-AP or AP Math <u>AND</u> Science Course. The same applies for ELA and SS. If your child is GT ALL AREAS, they must enroll in Pre-AP or AP Math, Science, ELA <u>AND</u> Social Studies course.

If your child is not enrolling in the appropriate courses, please contact your child's counselor to initiate **FURLOUGH** paperwork. A **FURLOUGH** allows a student to take a "leave of absence" from the program for specified reasons and for a designated period without being exited.
