Leadership is...Honesty and Integrity



The definition of **Honesty** is the quality or fact of being truthful, sincere, and fair. Honesty requires several other character traits such as good judgment, responsibility, loyalty, and courage.

Integrity is defined as being strong enough to do what you know is right. Integrity is also knowing the difference between right and wrong and choosing to do the right thing, even when it is difficult.

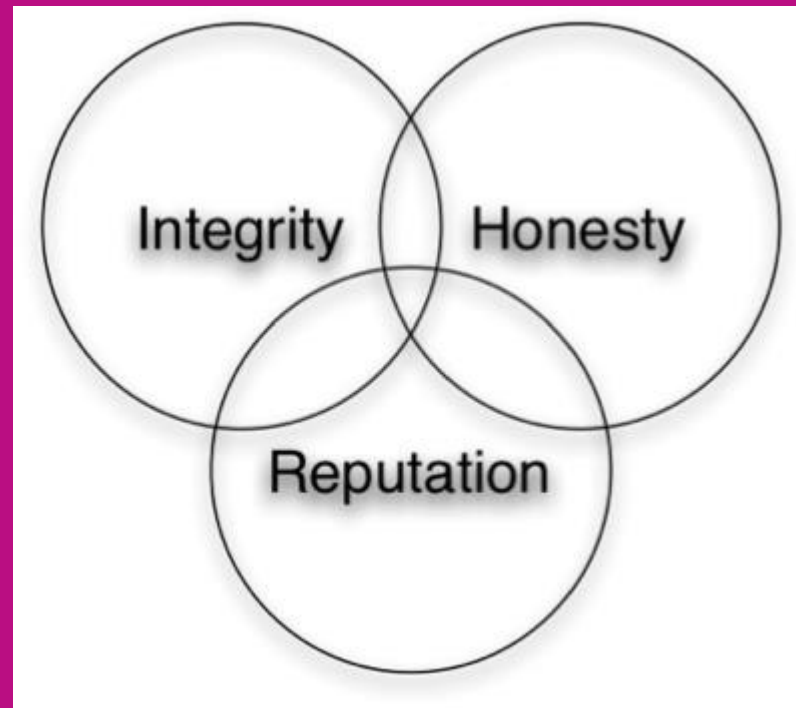

Speak with Honesty-Think with Sincerity- Act with Integrity



- Keep your promises even if it takes extra effort.
- Go back to a store and pay for something you forgot to pay for.
- Never betray a friend's trust even if you get in trouble.
- Inform the cashier he gave you too much change back.
- Do not let someone else take the blame for something you did.
- If someone gives you confidential information, never tell anyone what you know.
- Be responsible. Do what you say you will do.
- If you make a mistake and a team's project gets messed up or you miss a deadline, own up to your mistake. Don't let teammates take the fall.
- Work together as a team. This builds trust and shows integrity.
- Don't accept praise or acclaim for someone else's work.
- Turn in the extra change you found in the soda or snack vending machine.
- Do not gossip or talking badly about someone.

- **Honesty**: saying and doing the right thing. Follow rules and the law. Speak only truths.
- Admitting when you are wrong. Being accountable.
