8. No food or drinks in the classroom.


HONOR CODE

LATE / INCOMPLETE WORK



- My expectation is that **ALL** assignments be completed to a level of proficiency (**70% or higher**) and turned in on time. Late work results in an immediate 0.
- Printer and Internet issues are not an excuse for late work.
- Missing grades will not be turned in or made up a week before grades are due. If grades are due on a Friday the previous Thursday before the gradebook will be closed. Work being made up will not have a priority and may not be graded or entered into the gradebook in a timely manner. Repeat missing assignments will eventually require a conference with parents.
- Any student receiving a grade lower than 75 on a test will have the opportunity to improve their grade through progressive testing within a week of the test. Each test in a 9 weeks period will include material from the previous test. The student can raise their first test grade up to a 75, depending on how they do on the subsequent test.
