The Board of Directors and Staff of the Fort Bend Education Foundation **(the Foundation or FBEF)** are pleased to present this Annual Report of the Foundation's accomplishments and activities during the 2021-2022 fiscal year.

We have enjoyed this "normal" year of activities, post COVID, as we celebrate our 30th Anniversary. With all of our activities in person, we were able to host FBISD alumni tailgate parties at home football games, our donor reception and grant award ceremony. In addition, we were able to be in person for our major fundraising events. Through the generous support of our donors and the volunteer efforts of our community, FBEF continued to advance its mission of enriching and enhancing the quality of education for all Fort Bend ISD students by funding and awarding grants for teachers, school sites, staff development and district-wide programs and initiatives.

With overwhelming community support, our signature events were able to get back to pre-pandemic levels. Our 22th Annual Back to School Scramble, 7th Annual Sugar Shindig, 19th Annual Education Expedition, and 29th Annual Gala allowed us to award over \$720,000 to FBISD teachers and schools through our grant programs.

In 2021-2022, FBEF awarded 216 grants for **\$472,000** to support the Grants to Teachers and Schools program. Additionally, **300** new teachers received grants of \$15,261, \$75,000 of Professional Develop-Through Grants. Heading into its \$36 million in grants to Fort Bend ISD teachers and schools. Through these grants, the Foundation makes a tangible impact to every school in Fort Bend ISD.

On behalf of FBEF's Board of Directors, I would like to express my sincere appreciation to all who have supported, volunteered, and served our Foundation for your ongoing friendship, commitment and dedication during these particularly challenging times. 





Who benefits from the fundraising?

Every school in Fort Bend ISD benefits from the Fort Bend Education Foundation grant programs that train teachers, provide equipment, and offer new instructional experiences to students of all ages. Each year, hundreds of grant proposals are submitted to the Education Foundation. Each proposal undergoes an extensive review process. The number of awarded

grants depends upon the amount of money raised through the Education Foundation's annual fundraising events.

This year, the Education Foundation awarded \$720,179, which will fund 216 Grants to Teachers and Schools, **300** new teacher gifts and various professional development programs and pass through grants.

Stem Teacher, Corrie Portier, requested 16 Sphero Robots for the school STEM Lab, along with accessories such activity mats and coding challenge cards. Every student in the school attends weekly enrichment classes in the STEM lab. The integration of the Sphero Robots into the STEM curriculum will provide 21st century learners with the technological skills essential for their future.



Palmer Elementary School

Palmer Elementary librarian Cindy Fukazawa received an FBEF teacher grant to purchase Legos and Duplo building blocks to help improve students' creative problem-solving and engineering skills. Students work individually or collaboratively with classmates to build fun structures.

Middle School - Abstinence **Empowers Your Future:** Simulating the Roles and Responsibilities of a Teen Parent - When teaching Growth and Development in Health class, Kenneth Lee

uses the Realityworks infant dolls to teach students about reproduction and the benefits of abstinence. The "Roles and Responsibilities of a Teen Parent" simulation helps students understand that their choices have a direct impact
