The Board of Directors and Staff of the Fort Bend Education Foundation (FBEF) are delighted to present this Annual Report, highlighting our accomplishments and activities during the 2024-2025 fiscal year. This past year, we not only met, but exceeded our fundraising goals. FBEF has remained steadfast in its mission to provide opportunities to enrich and enhance the quality of education for all Fort Bend ISD students by funding and awarding grants to teachers, campuses, staff development programs, and district-wide initiatives.

Thanks to the generous support of our donors and the tireless efforts of our community volunteers, our signature fundraising events – the 25th Annual Back to School Scramble, the 10th Annual Sugar Shindig, the 32nd Annual Gala, and our inaugural Sink-A-Dink pickleball tournament – enabled us to award over \$805,000 to FBISD teachers and schools through our grant programs.

In 2024-2025, FBEF awarded 327 grants for \$578,165 to support the Grants to Teachers and Schools program. Additionally, 300 new teachers received grants

of \$16,712, we awarded \$79,835 in Professional Development Grants, and the Foundation managed \$130,818 in Pass Through Grants. As we enter our 33rd year, FBEF has awarded over \$36 million in grants to Fort Bend ISD teachers and schools. These grants have a profound impact on every school in Fort Bend ISD.

I want to extend my heartfelt gratitude to everyone who has supported, volunteered, and served our Foundation. Your unwavering friendship, commitment, and dedication are deeply appreciated. 

# Who benefits from the fundraising?

Every school in Fort Bend ISD benefits from the Fort Bend Education Foundation grant programs that train teachers, provide equipment, and offer new instructional experiences to students of all ages. Each year, hundreds of grant proposals are submitted to the Education Foundation. Each proposal undergoes an extensive review process. The number of awarded grants depends upon the amount of money raised through the Education Foundation's annual fundraising events.

This year, the Education Foundation awarded **327** grants for **\$578,165** to support the Grants to Teachers and Schools program. Additionally, the Education Foundation has provided **300** New Teacher Gifts for **\$16,712**; **\$79,835** in Professional Development; and **\$130,818** in Pass-thru Programs.

Since its inception, the Education Foundation has awarded over **\$36** million in grants to FBISD teachers and schools.

# **GRANTS IN ACTION**

#### **Bhuchar Elementary**

Grant: Put Your Thinking Cap on Station Rotation

Learning math can be fun! Just ask third graders at Bhuchar Elementary. With funding for her "Put Your Thinking Cap on Station Rotation" grant, teacher Delicia Arnic purchased educational games to reinforce math concepts (such as place value, measurement and fractions) taught in the curriculum. The games allow students to collaborate and engage with peers in a fun way. As the students rotate between stations, they are building essential math, communication and problem-solving skills.

#### **Madden Elementary**

Grant: Let's make a POINT to start Strong in Letter Formation

Kindergarteners at Madden Elementary are learning proper letter formation thanks to teacher Ruth Schmalz, who received \$1,449 to fund her "Let's make a POINT to start Strong in Letter Formation" grant. She ordered sets of Trace & Write magnetic boards for students to use in the literacy stations. Students trace letters with their fingers, then use a stylus to write the letter on the board's surface. They practice repeatedly while working independently to strengthen their literacy skills!

# Sartartia Middle Schoo

Grant: Lights, Camera, Action

Students at Sartartia Middle School are preparing for future roles in broadcasting! Their teacher Supriya Jha received a \$4,999 school site grant to fund her "Lights, Camera, Action" project. Her students are benefiting from the use of new cameras and broadcasting equipment that support hands-on learning experiences in video production, editing, podcast development and creation of other authentic works!

# Reese Career and Technical Center

Grant: Geek Power Unleashed with Computer Building Kits

Knowledge of technology is essential today and teachers at the Reese CTC are ensuring that students grow their IT skills. With funding for their "Geek Power Unleashed with Computer Building Kits" grant, teachers Uwe Meyer and Charles Farr are helping students become proficient in building desktop computers. The students are even configuring Local Area Networks, and showcasing their skills at districtwide events (such as StemFest, CTE Expo and middle school Career Days).
