 - Decision based on:
 - Desire – responses to Likert scale questions
 - Attendance
 - Academic Progress
 - Discipline
 - Pre-requisites
- Application closes February 21, 2020 @ 10:00 PM
 - Acceptance emails sent to emails provided within the application process
 - Students must commit to acceptances

How does it work?



- AM and PM Rotations/Cohorts

Scheduling

- Home campus counselors, Dr. Valenzuela, and Reese staff will work together to build your schedule
 - 3 period CTE programs:
 - Cosmetology I + Principles of Cosmetology Design and Color Theory
 - Computer Maintenance + Lab + Principles of Information Technology
 - Welding I + Introduction to Welding
 - Potentially Audio/Video Production I + Lab + Principles of Arts, A/V Technology and Communications
 - All other CTE programs are 2 periods – students take a core class at Reese for their 3rd period
 - English 3, English 3 AP
 - English 4, English 4 AP
 - World History
 - Government/Economics
 - Anatomy & Physiology
 - Forensic Science
 - Edgenuity (O-Lab)
 - Potential addition: Geometry & Algebra II
- AM vs. PM - Extra-curricular activities and desired campus classes

Uniform Requirements



Monday – Thursday

Students expected to wear program-specific uniforms to class daily for all 3 periods.

Friday

Reese Casual Day – Instructors will determine if students/class can participate in Reese casual or if students need to wear uniform.

- Reese Center t-shirt with appropriate jeans (no holes above knee) or appropriate shorts or skirts (mid-thigh or longer, no biker shorts, etc.)
