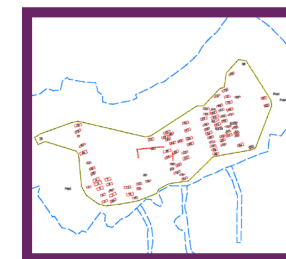

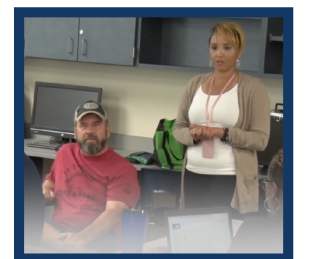
Bone fragments discovered on February 18, 2018.
