While you're enjoying your time off from school, the AHS AAC & AP English teams would like to encourage you to get a jump start on your reading for next school year. We will begin working with these reading selections during <u>the fourth week</u> of the 1st semester, so you will have time to complete your reading before we begin working with them in class.

Jumpstart Reading Suggestions:

We suggest you read a Dystopian Novel over the summer such as:Lexicon: A Novel by Max BerryFahrenheitReady Player One by Ernest ClineThe UglietThe Red Queen by Victoria AveyardEnder's G

Fahrenheit 451 by Ray Bradbury The Uglies (Book #1) by Scott Westerfield Ender's Game by Orson Scott Card

English 2 AAC (formerly Pre-AP)

We suggest you read at least one novel of your choice over the summer from any genre of literary merit. Consider using Goodreads, YASLA, or NPR to find book recommendations. We will assign an anchor text to be determined during the first week of school that we will begin working with the 4th week of school.

English III AP Language:

For AP 3, we recommend reading any non-fiction book of your choice and having a personal copy at the beginning of the year. Additionally, *They Say I Say* will be provided to each student as part of the textbook adoption. If you would like to obtain a personal copy for the school year, you may get one.
