Texas Immunization Registry (ImmTrac2)

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What is the Texas Immunization Registry?

Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS) offers the Texas Immunization Registry as a free service to all Texans for storing immunization records into a secure and confidential centralized system (ImmTrac2).

What do I need to know about the registry?

- ◆ All your vaccine records are stored in one place.
- ◆ Records are only accessible by authorized healthcare providers and yourself, not your parents.
- ◆ Schools and universities can verify your vaccine records.
- ◆ It's a free, secure, confidential service.



Why would I want to enroll in the registry?

You may need your immunization records for:

- ◆ Travel
- ◆ College entrance requirements
- ◆ Living abroad
- ◆ Military enlistment
- ◆ Employment, mainly in health and safety fields
- ◆ When changing doctors

Having accessible immunization records assists you in every stage of your life as vaccines are recommended throughout a lifetime.

How do I sign up for the registry?

Texas state law requires your written consent to have information stored in the registry. The consent form is quick and easy, and needs to be completed by you, not your parents.

- ◆ Visit www.ImmTrac.com to download and complete the ImmTrac2 Adult Consent Form (F11-13366).
- ◆ Send your completed and signed ImmTrac2 Adult Consent Form to your authorized Public Health Region, Local Health Department, or the Texas Immunization Registry.

If your records were stored in the registry as a child, you must complete the ImmTrac2 Adult Consent Form (F11-13366) between your 18th and 26th birthdays to keep them in the registry. If this form is not completed by your 26th birthday, your childhood records will be deleted.



How do I request a copy of my official immunization history?

To request a copy of your official immunization record:

- ◆ Visit www.ImmTrac.com to download and complete the ImmTrac2 Authorization to Release Official Immunization History Form (F11-11406).
- ◆ Send in your completed, signed ImmTrac2 Authorization to Release Official Immunization History to your authorized Public Health Region, Local Health Department, or the Texas Immunization Registry.
