# FBISD Safety Update-See something, share something-Nicholas Petito, FBISD Communications Public Information Officer

- -reporting info is important so the process of investigating can begin
- >How to report accurate info includes See Something, Share Something App-anonymous
- >This info is on posters at every campus and also on FBISD police website
- -FBISD Police Department dispatch-available 24 hours a day everyday
- -Crimestoppers-safe and anonymous system to give info about criminal activity, threats, drugs or weapons without fear of retaliation 281-491-TIPS
- community should share any threats seen on social media so officers can respond to the report and investigate
- Q. Under what circumstance should someone call TIPS or FBISD police first?
- A. Recommends Call FBISD first or use see something, share something app—BUT any way you choose to get info to the police is the most important
- Q. Incident at an elementary school when power went out and all doors were left open
- A. Protocols are in place for this situation-- Campus staff take necessary precautions to make sure students are safe-police dispatched to support the exterior of the campus

# A. AVDA-AVDA Services for students, parents and the community John Reyes, Prevention and Education Manager

- -AVDA -Aid to victims of domestic abuse
- -been in service to Houston area for over 40 years—started to support victims of domestic violence
- -offer presentations for schools and organizations-can accommodate various size groups and length of presentation
- -offer 5 week and 8 week programs for students -Safe Dates, Live Respect, Love 146-Not a Number -also has Domestic Violence 101 program for parents
- Q. For the 8 and 5 week programs do you do several within the campus?
- A. Yes, often stay on a campus for a whole day-Health class is often a good option-flexible on doing presentations

Q. Do you work with FBISD?

A. Just recently approved as a vendor in FBISD-any school can contact us for a presentation—will be presenting to all FBISD Health teachers in July

# **Casey Davis, Community Engagement Director**

- -Prevention programs for middle school and high school students
- -presentations are based on grade level-builds on itself over time
- -sexual abuse parts of the presentations do not include sex education—use concepts to teach about how sexual abuse occurs, body awareness
- -use 5 safety rules across all programming
- -middle school and beyond includes an online component
- -send home info to parents and caregivers and to school staff so they can follow up
- -to schedule a presentation-request online—take requests by school or from district level
- -about 2 weeks in a school to hit all grade levels in small groups so there is interaction and ability to ask questions

Q. How long have you been presenting this program? Who are presenters?

A. presenting for 2 years—staff member and trained volunteer go together

# C. Crime Stoppers-Safe School Institute 101

# Joshua Webb, Program Coordinator

- -safe school team presents to pre-k to high school
- -safe community team presents to adults
- -can report criminal activity or threats anonymously through TIP line
- -Safe School Institute—provide a hub for everything school safety
- >empower students to see something, say something-report anonymously
- >all programming is free—supported by grants and individual donors
- >each presentation is tailored to the grade level
- >go to all schools where invited- within 50 mile radius will be in person or can do pre-recorded or virtual presentations outside of that radius
- >operate year round—Houston parks locations mainly during the summer
- -Messaging
- >no scare tactics-give info to make healthy and safe decisions and what laws and consequences are
- >provide real life examples-help students realize they are not alone in what they are going through
- >work directly with campus needs—ex. created presentation on vaping because schools asked for it—will create programs to meet campus needs
- -variety of presentations for students and educators and parents
- -request presentation at crime-stoppers.org fill out online form
- -post-presentation support
- -virtual reach-Mondays and Tuesdays free virtual presentations
- -partnerships-Jet Blue, Mental Health Foundation of West Michigan, David's Legacy Foundation
- -student engagement opportunities-Child ID Kit community service project, Student Ambassador Leadership program, Annual High School PSA Contest
- -Expected results (slide)

Q. Can this program be used at all campuses even without Houston zipcode? A. Yes
