Why? The purpose of the plan is to guide District and Campus staff in improvement of student performance

Who? A cross functional team from departments across the District with input from stakeholder committees (DPAC, SHAC, etc.) Performance Objectives are approved by the Board of Trustees



Science and Social Studies Performance	Performance Objective 3: By June 2022, FBISD will improve student outcomes in social studies and science as defined by the evaluation metrics by ensuring strong Tier One classroom instruction targeting student ownership instructional strategies.
Closing the Gaps in Performance for all student groups	Performance Objective 4: By June 2022, FBISD will close gaps in performance for all student groups as defined in the HB3 Student Outcome goals and progress measures by ensuring strong Tiered classroom instruction through targeting student ownership instructional strategies.

Social Emotional Learning	Performance Objective 2: By June 2022, FBISD will improve social emotional learning by focusing on the development of student ownership of behavior practices and supports (PBIS) to improve the culture and climate of the campus as demonstrated through the Evaluation Metrics.
Disproportionality in discipline and threat assessments	Performance Objective 3: By June 2022, FBISD will decrease disproportionality rates of student groups, as demonstrated in disciplinary actions (ISS, OSS, DAEP) and threat assessments by ensuring strong implementation of established FBISD Multi-Tiered System of Support (MTSS)







GRANTS & TOOLKITS

- Reaching for Excellence in Texas School Health Grant: Deadline November 12th
 - Grants for schools and districts of up to \$10,000 for projects that inspire students to live healthier lives.
 - Projects should engage students, their families and the community and should include plans to continue the project past the initial 1-2 years.
- Oliver Foundation Healthy Choices Grant: Deadline is October 15th
 - Grants available for schools ranging from \$750 to \$5,000.
 - Physical activity and nutrition education components are required for the grants.
- Healthy at Home Back to School Toolkit
 - Alliance for a Healthier Generation released a back to school toolkit for parents and students. The toolkit contains self-care resources and a healthy day checklist with families to help everyone feel more calm, confident, and connected.
