Standards Based Grading in ELA classes



Standards Based Grading

What is Standards-Based Grading?

Standards-based grading is a system where students receive feedback around "fixed targets" or competencies. Non-academic factors (participation, late assignments, etc.) are removed, so the final grade represents what the student knows and can do.



Traditional Grading

Mixture of factors (assignments, tests, timeliness, etc.) Focuses on what is taught by teacher Final grade is an average Areas of weakness not well defined

Standards-Based Grading Represents what the student knows

and can do Focuses on what is learned by student Reflects recent evidence of learning Weaknesses and strengths are clear

Benefits of Standards-Based Grading



→Learning is prioritized over compliance →Growth mindset develops →Motivation to learn increases →Grades have meaning >Student ownership of learning increases →Multiple opportunities and ways to show learning →Clear vision of success
