
<u>ASL</u>:


- RPHS offers levels 1 through 5 AP for <u>ASL</u> courses.
- <u>ASL Dual Credit</u> is also offered for specifically heritage and native speakers of Spanish.
- The <u>ASL Dual-Credit class</u> allows students to earn two credits in one year of study, replacing <u>level 1</u> and <u>level 2</u> and therefore satisfying the requirement for graduation. After successful completion, these students have several options: go on to <u>level 3</u>, take <u>CBE</u> for level 3 / 4 regular, go to <u>level 4 AP</u>, stop their language study, or switch to <u>French</u>, <u>ASL</u> and start a new language.
- All students are required to take two years of foreign language to graduate under a regular graduation plan, but many colleges want to see three (3) years.
- At level 3, students may choose between <u>Spanish III</u> and <u>Spanish III Pre-AP</u>.

- Students are eligible for induction into the <u>Spanish</u> <u>National Honor Society</u> while taking Spanish III Pre-AP, IV AP, or V AP if they meet the SHH <u>bylaws</u> <u>requirements</u>.
- Spanish has two separate AP tests offered: <u>Spanish</u> <u>IV AP Language</u> and Culture and Spanish V AP Literature.
- Students who successfully completed <u>level 1</u> in middle school, should enroll in <u>level 2</u>. Students coming from the <u>GT Academy</u> should enroll in <u>Spanish III</u> or <u>Spanish III Pre-AP</u>.
- We also have a <u>Spanish Club</u> and <u>Paso a Paso</u> <u>Organization</u>, open to all <u>RPHS students</u>, regardless of whether or not they take Spanish.


All levels of both languages have the goal of using the target language 90% + every day. This does NOT mean the teacher speaking or signing in ASL, Spanish or French for 90% of the time, but that 90% + of every class will revolve around hearing, reading, speaking, writing, viewing, signing in the target language. Only through such consistent use can we reach our communicative goals.
