






COUNSELING INFORMATION:

Schedule changes will be taken into consideration under the following circumstances:

- There is a data entry error.
- The student completed a scheduled course in the summer of 2024.
- The student is scheduled for a course they previously passed.
- The student needs a course to meet graduation requirements.
- The student is scheduled for a course in which they do not have the prerequisites.
- The student was not placed in the appropriate level.
- The student is scheduled for a course they did not request. (Limitations based on schedule availability)
- The student's IEP plan was amended.
- During the Fall semester, students who want to level down in AAC/AP courses will go through the district-mandated level change policy during the level-down window.

Seniors:

- Off-Campus: Seniors might not have been assigned their preferred Off-Campus class due to course conflicts, failing to pass all EOCs, or not meeting CCMR requirements.
- Students may drop a course for Off-Campus if they have five for-credit courses remaining on their schedule, meet all graduation requirements, and meet CCMR status.

COLLEGE, CAREER, AND MILITARY READINESS (CCMR)

Students must be CCMR Ready before graduating. Will not have an off period your senior year if you have not met this criteria.

How?

- Meet Criteria on Advanced Placement (AP) Examination. A graduate meeting the criterion score on an AP exam of 3 or higher.
- Meet TSI Criteria via SAT, ACT, TSIA2, or College Prep Course in both English and Math. A graduate must meet the TSI requirement for both reading and mathematics but does not necessarily need to meet them on the same assessment. For example, a graduate may meet the TSI criteria for college readiness in ELA on the SAT and complete and earn credit for mathematics from the TSIA2.
- Earn Dual Credit Hours. A graduate completing and earning credit for at least <u>three</u> credit hours in ELA <u>or</u> mathematics or at least <u>nine</u> credit hours in <u>any</u> subject.
- Complete an OnRamps Dual Enrollment Course in any subject
- Earn an Industry-Based Certification.
- · Enlist in any branch of the U.S. military.

- FRESHMAN- ALGEBRA I, BIOLOGY, ENGLISH I
- SOPHOMORES- ENGLISH II
- · JUNIORS- US HISTORY
- · If you are not successful on an EOC, you will retest. Tutorials are available.
- You must pass all 5 to graduate.
 - · Also, you cannot have off periods your senior year if you are owing EOC exams.





TRANSITIONS

- You have 5 minutes to transition from one class to the next
- 3 Tardies=Unexcused Absence (will impact exemptions)
- If you are late to class, you are to report to a tardy station
- Walk with a purpose, and don't stop in the hallway
- Stairs by the library are one way. Honor the one way.
- Utilize the stairwells in the back of the 900/600 & 800/200 halls.
- Be respectful of people's space. There are over 2,000 students on campus and there should be NO RUNNING in the hallways

TARDIES

- You are tardy (late) for class when the bell starts to ring and you are not inside your classroom.
- An adult will direct you to the tardy station.
- You will give the recorder your ID number and they will check you in.
- You will then be sent back to class.

ATTENDANCE + EXEMPTIONS

ATTENDANCE GENERAL FACTS

- 90% Rule ...If you miss more than 10% of the school days, you may lose credit
- Only illness and death in family are excused absences (Dr. Visits do not count against you)
- Unexcused absences= truancy measures
- Continued truancy-->court

ATTENDANCE FOR EXEMPTIONS

- No more than 8 absences for the semester
- TARDIES COUNT AGAINST EXEMPTIONS!!!!!
- 3 Tardies=1 Absence
- If you have 6 absences and 5 tardies to 2nd period.....ok.
- If you have 6 absences and 6+ tardies to 2nd period.....NO EXEMPTION

LET'S TALK ABOUT RESTROOMS:

I.H. Kempner High School students are to utilize the restrooms near their classroom. The Commons (Cafeteria) restrooms are only open during breakfast and lunch.

KHS Restroom Standards

- No more than four students at a time
- No loitering
- Any behavior not aligned with FBISD Standards will face immediate and stern consequences



RESTROOM PASSES

- Color-coded by hallway
 - 200's yellow; 400's & 500's black;
 600;s blue; 713, upstairs offices &
 800's maroon; 709 & 900's orange
- Use restroom in designated hallways
 look for the color-coded signs that match the hall pass
- No more than one person at a time
- NO HALL PASS 1st and last 10 minutes of class, Advisory, and 5th period



BEFORE SCHOOL & AFTER SCHOOL

- Before school, head to the commons
- Tutorials are available, but only with a tutorial pass for that teacher.
- Gates in the 200, 600 hallways and upstairs will be closed until 7:20 am. Students will use the stairs by the library if they have tutorials upstairs.
- The library opens at 7:00 am. Shhhh
- Once on campus, you must stay on campus. Leaving campus without permission is a discipline violation.
- If you arrive at 7:20 or later, head directly to class.
- Roaming around the hallways is not permitted.
- Commons/Library loop is ok.

- Dismissal is at 2:50 pm.
- You must leave the building by 3:00pm
- You may not hang-out in the commons
- You must be with a teacher, coach or sponsor if you are inside.

TEXTBOOKS & LOCKER REQUESTS





The student will complete textbook and locker requests by scanning the QR code below or stopping by the downstairs AP Office.

Some of your Educators will request class sets or schedule a time to check out the textbook as a class.

All Fall-only textbooks must be turned in before checking out a Spring-only textbook.

LUNCHES

All students will remain in the Commons/Patio area during lunch. Students may loop/walk around the Commons/Library area. Students are required to have a Teacher-issued pass to visit a class during lunch.

KHS Cafeteria Standard

- Clean up after yourself

Lunch costs \$3 unless your parent/guardian fills out a Free or Reduced lunch application.

Lunch dismissal pattern to and from each lunch period

- A Lunch Enter/Exit: 200 & 600 Hallways
- o B Lunch Enter: Use the cafeteria stairwells

No food delivery during lunch!



Leaving Campus



- Students are not allowed to leave campus under any circumstance
- A parent must check in/check out students from the front office
- You CANNOT leave during lunch to get food
- No food delivery from Uber eats, door dash, etc. allowed
- Leaving campus WILL result in disciplinary consequences and may result in revocation of your parking permit

Cheating

- Cheating is defined as giving or receiving information or help on a test
- Possession of any unauthorized material during a test; copying another student's assignment or knowingly allowing another unauthorized student to copy from his/her assignment
- Grade reductions for cheating and plagiarism

Vandalism


- VANDALISM: Refers to willful or malicious damage to school grounds and buildings or furnishings and equipment. Damage to property equal to or in excess of \$2500 is felony criminal mischief and requires placement in a DAEP or Expulsion.
- Any vandalism on school property will lead to disciplinary action, and possibly legal action
- If you see something, say something!
- We will start shutting down restroom if vandalism or any other malicious activities occur

DRESS CODE

PARTIAL LIST OF COMMON INFRACTIONS

- Shorts, jeans, and all pants shall be worn at the hip or higher and must cover undergarments
- No low-cut or crop tops
- No revealing or see-through clothing
- No hats in the building
- Dresses, shorts and skirts must reach mid-thigh (Should be longer than your fingertips when your arms are by your side)
 - No biker shorts or athletic shorts (Nike/Iulu, etc.)
- Unsafe footwear is not permitted (i.e., house shoes, slippers)
- Shirts-Nothing that is offensive, vulgar, promotes alcohol tobacco or drugs. No nudity, death or violence, etc.

Dress Code



ALL STUDENTS

Clothing must cover areas from one armpit to the other armpit, down to the mid-thigh.

Tops must have shoulder straps and be long enough to adequately cover the waistline and not expose the midriff.

PARKING

Eligibility

- Must be a senior, junior, or sophomore for the current school year
- Must have a valid driver's license <u>and</u> be listed on the insurance for the vehicle
- Must have cleared all financial obligations
- You may be denied the PRIVILEGE to park based on attendance issues, discipline issues and/or parking /driving incidents

<u>Requirements</u>

- Parking permit must be displayed properly on your vehicle at all times
- Parking in Student lot only. Not along curbs, along fire lanes or in the Faculty/Visitor parking lots. All parking locations are clearly marked.

PARKING

Failure to follow parking requirements will result in fees/fines and possible revocation of your ability to park on campus. Must follow entrance and exit traffic patterns.

Loss of PRIVILEGE:

Behaviors that will cause students to lose the PRIVILEGE to park (not limited to):

- Tardy more than 10 times per semester throughout the school day
- Having two or more parking violations
- Leaving school grounds and/or taking others with you in your vehicle during the school day
- Dangerous driving in the lot
- Contraband in your vehicle
- * You will not be refunded parking fees if your parking PRIVILEGE is revoked

Parking Fees

- Parking permit: \$25
- Parking Violations-each: \$25
 - Entered into Fines and Fees List
 - Affects Exceptions, Graduation, etc.

Parking in student lot

- Car must be moved out of band practice area by **3pm** (green area).
 - Car may be moved as a last resort
 - Parking permit may be revoked
