# Pick-Up/Drop-Off Reminders

We have no higher obligation to our community than for providing a safe learning environment for our students. Please be mindful that we do not provide supervision of students before school until just before 8:00 and that the building opens to students at 8:20. Also, the Sugar Land Police Department has been issuing citations to drivers who violate the solid white line/dedicated right turn lane into the front circle drive, as well as to those who make a left-hand turn from the circle drive onto Seventh Street during posted hours. Please observe all traffic laws, and remain patient during our pickup and drop-off processes. Last, students who need to cross Seventh Street may do so at our designated crosswalk that is manned by a crossing guard. It is at the east end of the property. Help us keep your children safe by observing these points.

### Semester Exams

## Student Recognition Event #1 – November 17<sup>th</sup>

In an effort to help keep students focused on doing great work, keeping up with assignments, exhibiting excellent citizenship and discipline, along with good attendance, groups of students and teachers have designed a Student Recognition Event plan known as "Titans on the Rise." In an effort to focus on our campus mission statement which endeavors to provide a safe environment with high expectations leading to physical, social, emotional, and academic success, we believe this event will help improve campus climate and make school a better place to work and to learn. This event will also help to focus our students' efforts on living out the attributes of the FBISD Profile of a Graduate. We plan to repeat these in the second semester.

- When?: Friday, November 17

How Do Students Become Eligible to Attend?

- Have no disciplinary office referrals from October 23 through November 17 (the date of the event)
- Maintain an average of 75 or above in all courses as of PR3 (as of November 10)
- Not have an "N" or a "U" for conduct mark on PR3 (as of November 10)
- Between October 23 and November 10, have no missing assignments for any course, even if the student's average was a 75 or higher all courses on PR3

- Between October 23 and November 10, have no more than 2 tardies in any particular class (note that the 4th tardy to a class is an office referral, and office referrals automatically exclude students from attending the event)
- Between October 23 and November 10, have no more than 1 unexcused absence in any single class
- As of November 10, have no overdue books in the library
- Any discipline referral on or after October 23 that results in DAEP (or a more severe consequence) automatically excludes a student from all recognition events will hold this school year

We will have a preliminary list of eligible students posted in the common areas by Tuesday, November 14th; however, students may be removed from the list of eligible students due to disciplinary reasons up to and including the day of the event. Students who do not meet the criteria above will have an alternate activity to do that will help them earn points toward their T2 average.
