We have had an increasing number of incidents where devices have been used to taunt and possibly bully students--cyberbullying--especially through the use of picture-based social media apps, such as Snapchat. Please take some time to review positive social interactions with your child, as well as to review the media content on your child's device(s).

An additional item to consider related to digital media is the game of **Fortnite**, which is available in app form for mobile devices, as well as for traditional computers.
