Several students took advantage of today's **Open Gyms**, courtesy of our wonderful coaching staff. We are doing it again tomorrow (Friday) from 10:00 – Noon. Please come out and enjoy some time with your friends tomorrow if you like.

I know that as we return to school next **Tuesday, September 12**th, your child(ren) will be well cared for. Several members of the campus leadership team met today to forge a plan to re-enter the school year in a way that supports students' social-emotional needs but also lays the foundation to move into academic success. Details of those plans are discussed below. We will also work to support any students who were displaced because of Harvey. If your child(ren) have been displaced, please contact or visit the campus starting tomorrow Friday, September 8th. Under the McKinney-Vento Act, you may be eligible for free meals, transportation, and other services. Registration times are available tomorrow Friday, September 8th and again on Monday, September 11th. Registration availability will be from 8:00-Noon and 1:00-4:00 each of those days. Details About Re-Opening and Our First Day – Tuesday, September 12th

- Bus Route Information is available online, and it will remain the same for all of our students as it was
 prior to Harvey. Thank you in advance for your patience, as it is typical that there are delays as the
 school year begins, and we know that like our students, our staff members and bus drivers are also
 "re-starting" the school year
- Building opens to students at 8:20 AM
- Students report to the following locations
 - o 6th grade Commons/Cafeteria
 - o 7th grade Boys' Gym
 - o 8th grade Girls' Gym
 - All students will find their names on an alphabetical list in their holding areas. After finding their name on the list, students will go sit with their first period teacher, whose name is also on the list. These lists are provided in case students have forgotten their first period teacher's name
 - We will redistribute copies of students' schedules, just in case they lost them; this will also include their locker number and locker combination

- Parents are reminded that there is no parking along Seventh Street and to observe all traffic signage.
