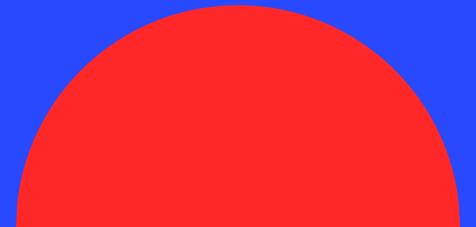
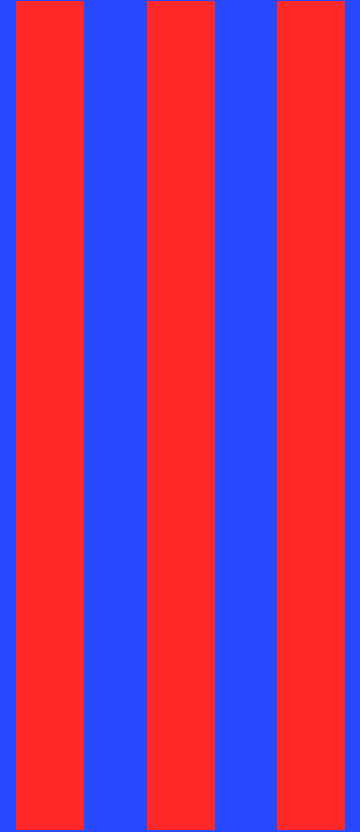

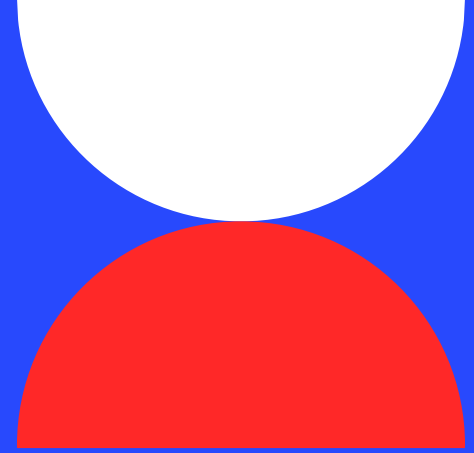

How to prepare your laptop and bluebook for AP Testing

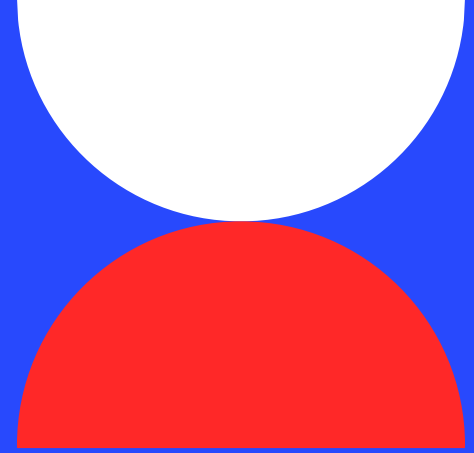
- You will be required to use your FBISD issued laptop.

- You CANNOT use your personal laptop!!!

many times!**

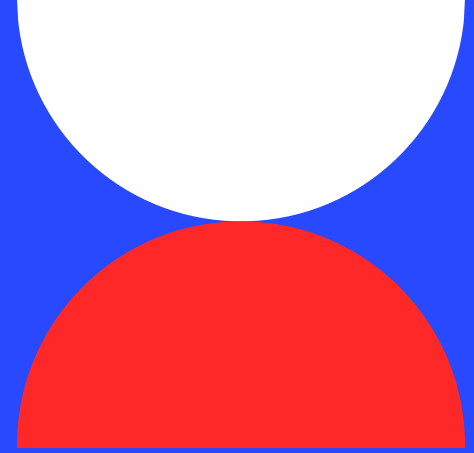


How to prepare your laptop and bluebook for AP Testing

- You will need to know your College Board login for your AP test
- You will need to make sure your Bluebook app has been updated
- **LOG IN TO BLUEBOOK TODAY!!**
- You can verify your login information and memorize it and update Bluebook!!

How to prepare your laptop and bluebook for AP Testing

- You will need to have your laptop fully charged, we will have limited outlets
- You will have to provide your own charger, if one is needed, we will not provide chargers

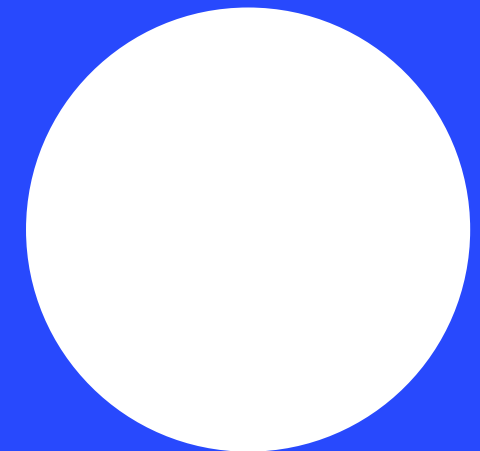
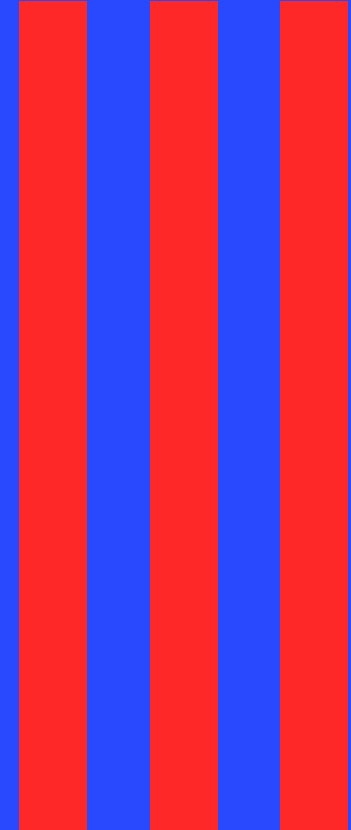

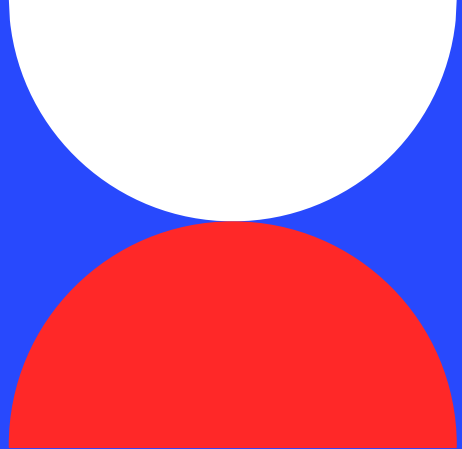

AP Exams Not Delivered Through Bluebook

- AP Art and Design (2-D, 3-D, Drawing)

You'll submit all work (three portfolio components) for scoring through the AP Digital Portfolio.

- AP Chinese Language and Culture, AP Japanese Language and Culture

These exams are administered on school-owned and -controlled devices through a separate exam application.

- AP Spanish Language and Culture

In these exams, you'll complete the multiple-choice and written free-response sections on paper, and you'll record your spoken free response on a device supplied by the testing school.

- AP Research

There's no end-of-course written exam for AP Research. Instead, you'll be assessed on performance tasks you complete that are based on your yearlong research project: an academic paper (which you'll submit for scoring through the AP Digital Portfolio), a presentation, and an oral defense of your research.

AP Exams Not Delivered Through Bluebook

- AP Art and Design (2-D, 3-D, Drawing)

You'll submit all work (three portfolio components) for scoring through the AP Digital Portfolio.

- AP Chinese Language and Culture, AP Japanese Language and Culture

These exams are administered on school-owned and -controlled devices through a separate exam application.

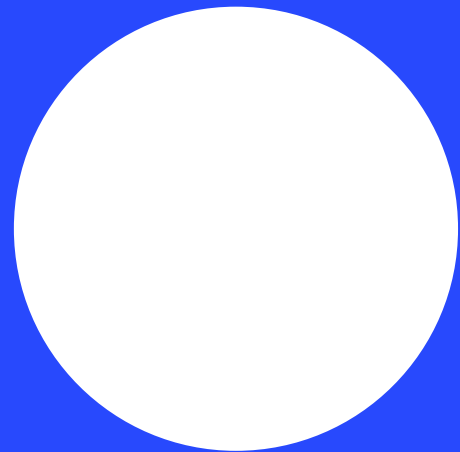
- AP Spanish Language and Culture

In these exams, you'll complete the multiple-choice and written free-response sections on paper, and you'll record your spoken free response on a device supplied by the testing school.

- AP Research

There's no end-of-course written exam for AP Research. Instead, you'll be assessed on performance tasks you complete that are based on your yearlong research project: an academic paper (which you'll submit for scoring through the AP Digital Portfolio), a presentation, and an oral defense of your research.

College Board ID requirements



Acceptable ID Examples – these must be current, valid ID's, they cannot be expired.

Government-issued driver's license or non-driver ID card. (This must be a physical document, not electronic.)

Official school-produced student ID card from the school you currently attend. (This must be a physical document, not electronic.)

Government-issued passport or U.S. Global Entry identification card.

Government-issued military or national identification card.

SAT Student ID Form: must be prepared by the school you currently attend or a notary, if homeschooled (only accepted in U.S. centers for students under 21 years of age).

College Board ID requirements

Unacceptable ID Examples

Any document that doesn't meet the requirements

Any document that's worn, torn, scuffed, scarred, or otherwise damaged

Electronic document presented on a device

Any document that appears tampered with or digitally altered

Any document that bears a statement such as "not valid as identification"

Credit or debit card of any kind, even one with a photograph

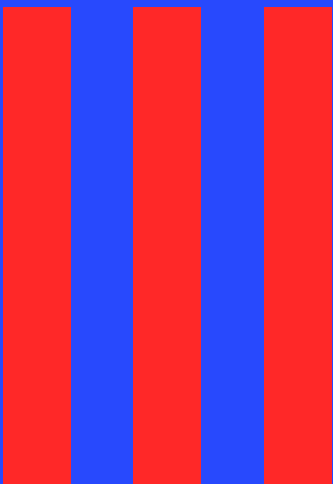
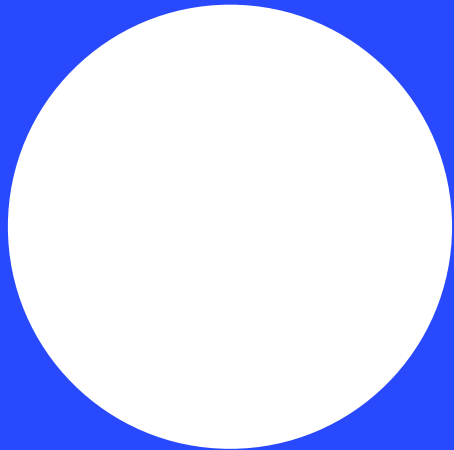
Birth certificate

Social Security card

Employee ID card


Missing Child (ChildFind) ID card

Any temporary ID card



College Board ID requirements

IF you do not have an acceptable ID, you can go to the College Board website or the DHS website and print off this ID Form. You will need to attach a picture and it must be signed by a school official BEFORE you arrive to test day.



Student ID Form

TEST STAFF:
This form is valid only if signed and sealed by a school official or notary. Forms signed by school officials must be printed on school stationery. Don't accept this form as valid identification outside of the United States and/or if the test taker is 21 or over.

College Board ID requirements

You cannot have stickers, that cover your picture, on your school ID. If you need a new school ID, you can see Mrs. Flores in the A wing office and pay \$5.00



You must have an acceptable ID or you will not test and we will not reschedule your test



You have time to get a “Student ID Form” filled out NOW, not at the last minute. You must provide your form filled out, with the picture, to Mrs. Garrey, and the counselors will complete and return it to you within 2 school days. Your poor planning is not our emergency. **PLAN AHEAD!**

You must know how to log into your College Board account

- If you do not know your login for your College Board account, it will ask you for a secure pin that College Board will want to text you, but you cannot have your phone, so this will not work!
- If you do not know your login for your College Board account, you will not be able to test.
- We will not order a late test because you did not know your College Board login – you have been warned!!!

WHAT TO BRING ON TEST DAY!

- YOU MUST HAVE AN ACCEPTABLE ID – see previous slides
- Bring your SCHOOL ISSUED LAPTOP, FULLY CHARGED!
- Bring your laptop charger – we do not provide chargers

WHAT TO BRING ON TEST DAY!

Put all allowable items in a clear plastic bag –
PENCIL BAGS ARE NOT ALLOWED!

- Bring pencils – cannot be mechanical pencils
- Bring a pen – black or blue ink
- Calculator for exams that allow a calculator – make sure it is an acceptable calculator by College Board standards
 - There is a built in Desmos calculator as an option on Bluebook exams

DO NOT BRING TO AP TESTING

DO NOT BRING ANY ELECTRONIC DEVICES – phones, smartwatches, smart glasses or wearable technology of any kind, laptops, tablet computers, Bluetooth devices**, portable listening or recording devices, cameras or other photographic equipment, devices that can access the internet, separate timers of any type, and any other electronic or communication devices.

DO NOT BRING TO AP TESTING

- DO NOT BRING any stylus pens, Apple pens, smart pens, iPad pencils, and other electronic writing instruments.
- DO NOT BRING ANY BAGS OR BACKPACKS – leave them at home or make arrangements with a teacher
- DO NOT BRING ANY books, notebooks, compasses, correction fluid, dictionaries, highlighters, or notes.
- DO NOT ARRIVE LATE!! We start on time, if you are late, you will miss your exam and we do not order make up exams for late arrivals

Arrival times and lunch



Arrive at testing room at 7:15 AM for 8:00 AM test

We will begin on time, no late arrivals.

SET YOUR ALARMS!

If you have an afternoon test, you will go to A lunch. We recommend that you bring your lunch because you will have limited time to eat.

You will have to be at your test room by 11:30 AM to check-in for the afternoon test.

We will begin at 12:00 PM. We will begin on time, no late arrivals!

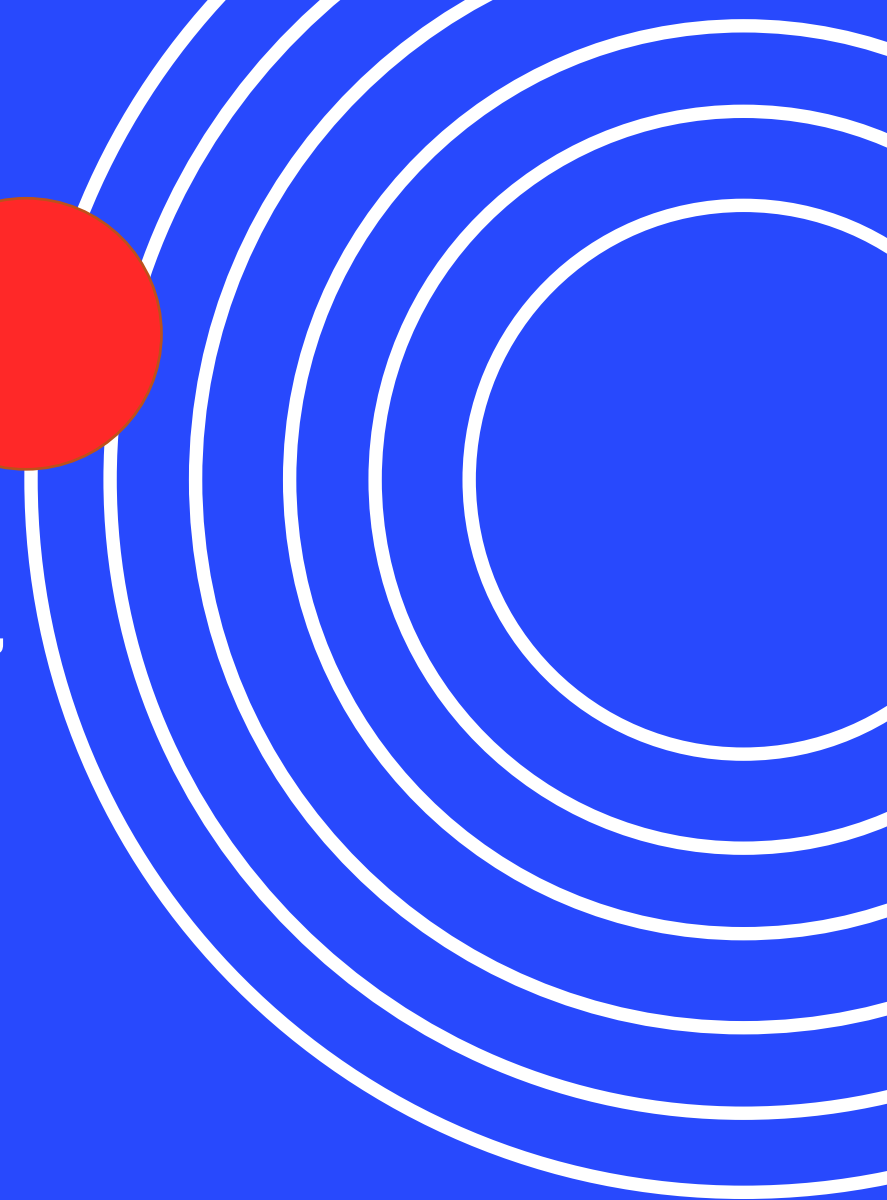
PM Exams transportation

We will not provide transportation for students after the afternoon AP exams and buses will have already left campus.

Free AP Score Sends is new for 2026

When students sign in to My AP, they'll see a pop-up window prompting them to choose a college, university, or scholarship organization to receive their AP scores for free before they reach their dashboard. Seniors will have to choose a score-send recipient in order to continue accessing AP Classroom and their course resources and assignments




Free AP Score Sends is new for 2026



If students don't know which college or university they want to receive their scores, they can choose the school they're most likely to attend or select "I don't want to send a free score report." They can come back to My AP any time before **June 20, 2026** to change their selection.

Their official score report will be sent in July, and it will include scores for the AP Exams that they take this year as well as any past AP Exam scores.



Do I have to send my AP scores? 2 options:

Option 1:

The AP Program allows you to cancel your AP Exam scores. When you request cancellation, your exam won't be scored, and if it has already been scored, the score will be permanently deleted from our records. Once a score is canceled, it can't be reinstated. There's no fee for this service, but your exam fee is not refunded. Archived scores can't be canceled.

Scores can be canceled at any time, but for scores not to be sent to the college or university you designated [using your free score send](#), AP Services for Students must receive your request by June 15 of the year you took the AP Exam.



Do I have to send my AP scores? 2 options:

Option 2:

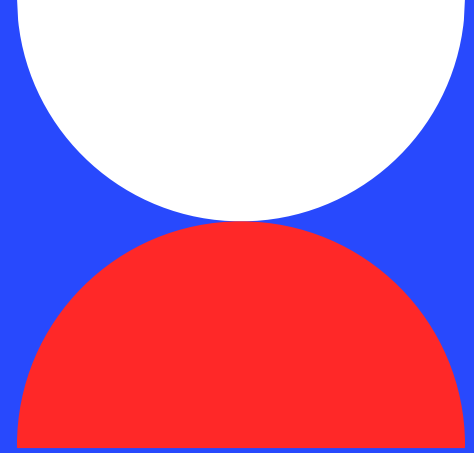
Another option is to choose to withhold one or more AP Exam scores from any college or scholarship program that you choose as a score recipient. The score will be withheld from any future score reports sent to that college or scholarship program. Unlike a cancellation request, a request to withhold a score does not permanently delete your score. The fee to withhold a score is \$10 per score per college, which does **not** include the cost to send your score report to the designated institution.

You may later remove the withhold by sending AP Services a signed written request. There is no charge to remove a withhold on a score.

For scores to be withheld from the college or university you designated using your free score send, AP Services for Students must receive your request and payment by June 15 of the year you took the AP Exam.
